My comment on this proposal

Harmonising water supply rates has the effect of a Waitomo village resident subsidising the district schemes while paying one of the highest per unit costs in the district for our own services.

What do you think about our plans for our projects and activities? Is there an opportunity for the Waitomo Isite and museum to be included in integrating customer services with local Isite services? I would support any initiative assisting visitor awareness of the numerous walking and cycling trails in and around the Waitomo Village.
