DULCIE WORKS HER 'GOLDMINE' AT 91

Tongaporutu's Dulcie Richards turns 91 this month and she's still working every day - at her goldmine.

"Dulcie's Goldmine" is what Mrs Richards calls the public toilets she polishes with all the care and attention every good loo deserves.

She has cleaned the toilets for the last nine years, which are just a short ride on her mobile scooter down the road from her house. As far as Mrs Richards is concerned, she will work on her goldmine for as long as she can.

Her task is made easier by the fact the toilets are not a well known or regular pit stop for squirming travellers, so the bad days are thankfully few and far between.

She said New Plymouth District Council paid her fortnightly. "They're very good, they supply all the paper rolls and everything". Councillor Elaine Gill said Mrs Richards did a magnificent job, it was a pity that all toilets in New Plymouth were not of the standard Mrs Richards achieved at Tongaporutu.

Mrs Richards was born in New Plymouth, has lived in the Taranaki region all her life and has lived in her house at Tongaporutu for 50 years. She believed she was blessed because she has been lucky with her health. A sense of humour had also kept her going.

(Mrs Richards passed away August 2012, aged 99)

May 4th is World Asthma Awareness Day.

New Zealand has one of the highest rates of asthma in the world, affecting up to 1 in 7 children and 1 in 8 adults. Asthma is a common lung condition that causes narrowing of the breathing tubes (airways) that carry air in and out of your lungs.

Asthma causes wheeze and cough and can make it difficult to breathe.

Common asthma triggers are colds (viruses), exercise, dust, pollens, and cigarette smoke. These triggers cause your air passages to tighten up, swell on the inside and produce more mucus.

As a result, the airways become narrower, making it difficult for air to move into your lungs, and even more difficult for air to move out.

Learning about asthma, what causes it and how it is treated can help you avoid triggers and keep your symptoms under control.

There are excellent online tools and information on Healthify NZ and Asthma NZ.

If you or your loved ones have asthma, take your inhalers as prescribed and seek urgent medical help if you have severe asthma symptoms.

As most are aware I finished my time as Mokau District Nurse at the end of April. It has been a pleasure and privilege to serve the community for the 18 months I have held this role. Thank you all for your acceptance and trust in me. I believe the district nurse role is vital in our community, and I ask you support the next nurse to settle in and grow the service. This month the clinic days will be shared between Emma-Gene and Gail (Urenui district nurse), watch this space going forward.

The long-term plan submissions have closed. Well over 2500 submissions were received and I would like to thank all those who took the effort to express or thoughts of support or concern. A hot topic has been the proposed closure of the Hutiwai Transfer Station, and council got the message from a variety of sources that the community would like it not only to remain open but also be more accessible and resourced for recycling materials. Will stay close on this.

Last month I spat the dummy with council over the state of Mohakatino Rd. Major works are planned in Sept/Oct this year and a meeting has been set up in Chris Wise's workshop for them to let us know what their plans are. Other rural roads in the district are proposed to go back to metal and this could be another one. Pls turn up and express your thoughts. Meeting 2pm on 23rd May at the Wise man's place.

Over the past 12 months the community board and council have been working with the Tongaporutu residents to enhance the domain area, including tiding up the Clifton Rd reserve and suppling plants. Well, the bug has been catching and a few locals have taking this to the next step. A community group has been established to expand the community gardens in the area and are seeking further support of the community board. MEETING AT MOKAU HALL ON MAY 21 FROM 1-2.30PM Point Road - Erosion Issues

Dear Resident,

POINT ROAD, MOKAU - EROSION ISSUES

We have been advised that during the ratepayers meeting on 6 January 2024, at the Mokau Hall, residents had asked for specific advice about what are the planning requirements for coastal erosion structures.

We have discussed this matter with the Waikato Regional Council (WRC) and have agreed to set out the planning requirements for both Waitomo District Council (WDC) and WRC in this letter. We have also agreed to arrange a meeting in Mokau to discuss this advice with residents. We are wanting to hold this meeting at 1-2.30pm on the 21st May 2024 at the Mokau Hall.

In general, if you want to build a seawall or other hard protection structure:

- Below the mean high water springs mark (the average high tide line), you will need a resource consent from the Waikato Regional Council under the Regional Coastal Plan.
- Above the mean high water springs mark, you will likely need a resource consent from the Waitomo District Council under the district plan.

The boundary between the regional council and district council jurisdictions is the mean high water springs mark. This is roughly the line of the average high tide, but in some cases can include areas further upstream in rivers. The area below the mean high water springs mark out to the 12 nautical mile limit is defined in the Resource Management Act 1991 as the 'coastal marine area'.

Operative Waitomo District Plan

I have set out below the relevant provisions of the Operative Waitomo District Plan (ODP) in relation to coastal hazards.

The relevant provisions for buildings in Chapter 27 are as follows:

- Rule 27.5.2.1(a) of the ODP sets out that any building to be located within the Prohibited Activity Area at Mokau identified on Planning Maps 33A and 33B Shall be a prohibited activity. This means that no buildings may be constructed in this area.
- Rule 27.5.2.1(b) Any building to be located within an area identified on the Planning Maps or within Rule 25.5.2.2 as Coastal Hazard Area A shall be a non-complying activity. Resource consent must be obtained before any building can be constructed in this area. Please note that any resource consent application would need to be designed by a suitably qualified and experienced engineer.
- Rule 27.5.2.1(c) Any building to be located within an area identified on Planning Map 33A and 33B at Mokau as Hazard Area B shall be a Discretionary Activity. Please note that any resource consent application would need to be designed by a suitably qualified and experienced engineer.


