FLIGHTLESS PIOPIO SIGHTED ON COLLEGE GROUNDS

As you leave our village heading south on SH₃, glance to your left to see Piopio's newest attraction the outstanding limestone Piopio, a native New Zealand Thrush, set in the hillside of Piopio College.

It took weeks of preparation planning, designing and layout trials – to be ready to begin the hard graft by a core of Year 10 students. The challenge was to get the right proportions based on the shape of the slope. Once the pattern of the Piopio was laid out using bed sheets the outline was marked using pink paint.

The students turfed the pattern, excavating approximately twenty tonnes of soil. This was replaced

with forty tonnes of crushed limestone and shaped for water runoff. Shovels, spades and wheelbarrows were the main tools, resulting in a few blisters along the way. The enthusiasm and effort shown by the students was as outstanding as the resulting image.

However this project would never have flown without Duncan Clarke and Grayden Haine from McDonald's Lime arranging the sponsorship of the crushed limestone, with Hayden Cody from Cody Haulage ensuring the three loads were delivered free of charge – a huge vote of thanks to these guys who supported a local community project.

PLAYCENTRE 50 YEARS

This year marks the 50th anniversary of Piopio Playcentre. Established in 1964 it first operated from the Presbyterian church hall. Following much fundraising and a grant from the Department of Education, the Playcentre moved to the present purpose built site adjacent to Piopio Primary School.

Over the years extensions have been made and sheds have been added to store outdoor equipment. In 1995 a new playground was erected. Today fundraising continues as the committee undertakes to raise money for a shade sail to cover parts of the outdoor play area.

Continual improvements to the site is a constant reminder of the many

families whom have had connections to this Playcentre.

This early childhood centre has seen hundreds of children during its time, and the invaluable support provided for parents and families can not be forgotten. Often life long friends are made when families join and parents and caregivers alike often comment, "It's a support network for families to talk about like minded activities and family happenings."

COUNCIL NEWS

After a second, drought induced, delay to our road grading and maintenance programme, most of our roads are showing signs of deterioration, and a number of residents have expressed their dissatisfaction to me about inaction after service requests have been lodged.

I've discussed the situation with our staff, and it appears our contractors are having great difficulty completing their work programme. Last year, outside grading crews were bought in to help clear the backlog, however, that initiative has not been implemented thus far. At this stage (May 22nd), four, of the 32 roads on the priority list have been serviced, so I fear some of our roads will get worse before they get better. Staff are using all the sanctions available under the contract to improve the situation, but success to date has been limited.

It has been suggested to some rural residents, by the contractor, that the Council has run out of money, so the work can't be done. I can assure you that Council has all the money needed to pay for the work, required to be done, when it is completed to the contracted standard.


On a brighter note, Piopio folk will have noticed building activity at the Memorial Hall, where Matt and Cameron are making good progress with the toilet upgrade, despite uncovering a couple of unexpected challenges.

The removal of the two large trees at Kara Park, removes the threat of falling branches, not clearing a big enough site for the new toilets. Their dimensions will be 10.2m x 4.6m, based on a patronage count, although their design will allow for easy expansion, if required, in the future. Tender documents for their construction will go out shortly.

I see the Mokau/Awakino community have raised sufficient funds to allow them to commence construction of their new St Johns ambulance base in Mokau. My congratulations go to the fundraising committee. This is another fine example of the way our small communities can work together to move mountains – well done.



Science-Energy and the concepts, or big ideas, are our focuses that we wanted our children to learn. These examples of learning, courtesy of Room 1, our New Entrant 5 year olds, and Room 5, our 7-8

year olds, cover two of those concepts.

There is a connection between mushrooms and energy and Room 1 found out this week what it was.

When you use electrical energy to heat an electric fry pan and cook mushrooms, they become hot, shrink and become soft and you can eat them.

The electricity is transferred to heat which heats the element in the fry pan which is transferred to the mushrooms, causing them to change shape and texture.

All this learning from one boy who brought a large mushroom to school and a clever teacher who saw the opportunity to add it to the learning she'd planned. The big benefit was you can eat your experiment! Energy makes things happen by generating forces that do work.

After their visit to the Climbing Wall in Hamilton and seeing how pulleys were used on harnesses to help keep them safe while scaling the many exciting and challenging walls, they decided to make their own mini climbing walls, complete with a miniature climber and pulley system, to demonstrate that energy can generate a force to help lift a weight, in this case themselves.

Once these are completed and working, they will show Pip and Fiona, the class teachers, that each child understands an

example of the concept of energy generating forces that do work.




