WHAT'S HAPPENING AT THE MUSEUM?

Firstly, a warm welcome to our two new volunteers Jan Crofskey from Tongaporutu and Heidi Preston from Mokau. Now that the whitebait season is coming to an end, we are hoping for more volunteers to help man the museum which is open seven days, 10am - 4pm. Please consider joining the team – you don't need any prior museum experience and it's only half a day's duty for 3 hours.

After reading last month's Tainui Trader article about 'The Kingfisher' several people have expressed an interest in lending a hand with the project of housing this historic boat. Urenui and Districts Lions Club have also pledged their support. We will keep you informed about progress.

Our most exciting innovation this month is the installation of five interactive kiosks. At the push of a button, visitors can now see footage taken from the 'Heritage Rescue' TV programme which explains the scrimshaw bullock horns, the bone heru (Maori comb) found by Steve McKenzie, the two Wetere taiaha, the cannonball fired from 'The Sturt' and the colourful Carruthers story. For this wonderful addition to our museum, we acknowledge the thousands of dollars worth of donated parts, services and countless hours put in by Barrie Carruthers and his team. Barrie you are an absolute legend. We thank you again, along with Frank Hagenson, Gowrie Carruthers, Peter Carruthers, Peter Chapman and Chubb NZ. You have added something of immense value to the museum experience and brought an educational element to what we have to offer the public.

We hope you all come to the museum to see not only the new interactive kiosks, but also the latest exhibition in the art gallery. Replacing the wonderful Waitomo Caves in 1924, is a solo show by Kiwi landscape photographer Harley Betts, a bachowner at Tongaporutu. Harley was raised on a farm in South Taranaki where he began his love affair with coastal landscapes. Hundreds of photographic journeys around Aotearoa New Zealand have produced this outstanding collection which includes several stunning shots taken within the Tainui region. The Three Sisters at Tongaporutu is worth coming to see.

TAINUI HISTORICAL SOCIETY MOUNT MESSENGER TUNNEL

It's interesting that so little data is available on a tunnel that must be driven through on the main highway north, going to or from New Plymouth.

Mount Messenger was named after Captain Messenger, who was in charge of the survey party that put the first track over the mountain.

The issue of maintenance to the existing Main North Road was hotly debated for many years, culminating in a decision made in 1890 to release the Clifton County of its responsibility to keep it in good order.

In response, the Government ordered the Council to take responsibility, saying the Pukearuhe, Tongaporutu, Makahu roads maintenance was their problem. The road fell further into disrepair, drawing many letters of complaint from unhappy travellers.

Often described as a 'bog-hole', not only the road but the state of the Te Horo Tunnel caused dismay. It was declared that Government should do all it could to put a road through. It was proposed that new settlers, as a condition to acquiring land, be asked to provide road-making labour when necessary.

Around 1890, the Government bought land north of Pukearuhe, opened it up for settlement and made a new, improved road, over Mount Messenger. In 1896, a road was pushed over the Mount Messenger Range. Soon, settlers lobbied for a bridge across the Tongaporutu River. A bridge was built in 1901, but the condition of the Mount Messenger Road fluctuated until more substantial sandstone retaining work was done.

A stormy season in 1915 saw it closed for a time. A tunnel to relieve some of the problems was planned. By 1916, a single-laned tunnel had been dug on a tight right-hand bend on the northern side. It stood in its original form until 1990, when it was widened to two lanes and heightened to allow oversized trucks safe passage through.

The twisting, winding road over Mount Messenger has been fully metalled since 1923. Today, it is no longer a dangerous, slow climb, though tourists often complain of having to negotiate its bends. To those from Taranaki, coming from the North, it is simply the way home.

Dog Control – owner responsibilities

All dogs in the Waitomo District should be registered with WDC. We ask owners to notify us if your details change, for example if the dog has died or has been transferred to a new owner. Registration and micro-chipping are important because it means your dog's details are on record in the Council's animal control system. Microchipping is very successful in reuniting lost or stolen dogs with their owners. The microchip provides a secure, life-long unique identification number for your dog, which is recorded on both WDC's records and the National Dog Database. We provide a microchipping clinic every Friday from 2.30pm to 3.30pm. The cost is \$20.00 per dog. Please contact our Customer Services Team on 07-878-0800 to book an appointment.

A friendly reminder that dogs are prohibited from a defined area on the Mokau river esplanade from 1 December to 31 March. A map outlining the prohibited area can be viewed on page 13 of the Dog Control Bylaw.

Owners can walk their dogs off-leash on other beach areas in Mokau provided they are kept under the control of their owner at all times.

Restricted Fire Season is coming

Council's Restricted Fire Season will commence in January 2017 (or earlier if dry weather conditions develop). This information will be communicated through our various channels. Anyone lighting an open air fire will need to obtain a Fire Permit from Council. There is no cost to obtain a permit.

Water Conservation is key

We encourage Mokau residents to conserve water. Summer's rising temperatures often coincide with rising outdoor water use.

Sweep driveways, sidewalks, and steps rather than hosing them off.

Raise your lawn mower blade. Longer grass promotes deeper root growth.

Check your garden hose regularly for leaks. Store it on a reel to prevent kinking and damage.

If you water the garden, do it in the evening or in the early morning to reduce evaporation.

Rubbish and Recycling services

WDC blue rubbish bags can be purchased from the Mokau Museum, Whitebait Inn, and the Junction Service Station in Awakino. One blue bag can be used to dispose of around one week's worth of residential rubbish. We provide a weekly kerbside collection service. Place your blue rubbish bag and green bin on the kerbside outside your bach/property in Mokau & Awakino by 8am on Tuesdays. Please do not leave rubbish bags on the side of the road outside of collection day - it attracts dogs and creates an unsightly mess. Recycle plastic (types 1 & 2 only), glass (clear, green, brown), paper/cardboard, tin and aluminium cans. You can also dispose of household rubbish and recycling at the Awakino Transfer Station located on Manganui Road open 9am - 1pm Monday and Wednesday, 8am - 12 noon Saturday and 1pm - 5pm on Sunday.

We provide a Public Recycling Station in Mokau Village (next to toilets) to encourage the public to recycle **small volumes** of plastic, glass, tin cans and paper. Please no light bulbs, glass plates/bowls, window glass or broken glass in the public recycling bin. **DO NOT PUT bagged rubbish into/ or next to the public litter or recycling bins - it is an offence and may incur substantial fines.**

For all after hours service requests and complaints please contact WDC on 0800 932 4357. Our call centre operates 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

From Your Councillor

Another year has raced by and it's almost time for our annual Ratepayers Meeting. I have booked the Mokau Hall for Saturday 1.00pm, January 7, so hope you can find time to come along.

I know most of you groan under the rate burden you bear and rubbish disposal and waste management plays a part in that. I recently became aware that Council is responsible five old rubbish dump sites, with one on Te Mahoe Road. Consent conditions impose on us a responsibility for monitoring and maintaining those sites, forever, and each site is currently costing \$20,000 per year.

Hopefully the Mokau Water system is functioning again properly after the recent interruptions. We've taken the opportunity to remove the pump station and decommission the wooden reservoir, which was due for expensive maintenance, and have increased reservoir capacity above the treatment plant so we can now gravity feed to all connections. The pump station was previously required to service about five higher elevation properties.

Hope you all have a good Christmas and New Year, and I'll see as many of you as possible at the Hall on Saturday 7th January.
