RURAL BROADBAND FOR PIOPIO NEEDS YOUR SUPPORT

As a result of frustration, expense and poor connectivity, local business owner Karen Barrett of Struan Farm, recently contacted King Country MP Barbara Kuriger to lobby the government to address the poor access for Ultra Fast Broadband, Rural Broadband, and Black Spot Mobile Areas.

In line with recent publicity from the Minister for Communications, Hon. Amy Adams, advises that the Government is to make further funding available to invest in better connectivity for New Zealand.

In an effort to explore if Piopio and districts might be eligible for this funding, a signed letter from more than 20+ local business owners and other interested individuals from Piopio and surrounding districts, was sent to Mayor Brian Hanna. A request for Council to investigate further into the limited access in the wider Piopio surrounds, including Aria, Paemako, Mangaotaki and Mahoenui areas were outlined.

Karen commented "to ensure better connectivity, it is important for our area's economic development, for rural productivity to have enhanced technology applications accessible, and for our children's education that Piopio's rural surrounds are not left disconnected."

Local Mayor Brian Hanna and staff have instigated a formal survey to gauge the issue and it's now crucial this project gets your support, as a community voice is only as big as its need.

The Government intends to implement three programmes to further upgrade and extend broadband services and the coverage of mobile networks in New Zealand.

The programmes and funding are:

- Ultra-Fast Broadband 2 (UFB 2), has additional funding of between \$152-\$210 million and plans to connect at least 80 per cent of New Zealanders to the fibre network;
- •Rural Broadband Initiative 2 (RBI 2), is a \$300 million project which aims to provide upgraded broadband services in rural areas;
- •Mobile Black Spots Fund (MBSF) of \$50 million is to extend mobile services to key tourist areas and priority areas on State Highways. The Government is inviting local authorities to submit a Registration of Interest to inform which areas should be a priority for the Government's investment.

The Waitomo District Council believe that the economic and social benefits of better connectivity would have a positive impact on our communities, businesses, schools, health care and emergency services.

More often than not slow connection speeds, high internet costs and installation expenses are a barrier to using technology.

As an initial part of the rural broadband initiative, Benneydale and Aria are expected to receive new cell towers enabling wider mobile phone coverage and broadband access through the Vodafone network, later this year.



XPLORERS **CONNECTION WITH** PIOPIO AND DISTRICT 1882

Local artist Peter Hollbrook sheds some light on the history and travels of the Austrian naturalist, Andreas Reischek 1845- 1902 – the Explorers connection with Piopio and district 1882.

Combined with Peter's passion for local history and talent as an artist, he is working on an oil painting of Andreas Reischek in his collectors clothes, with rifle and axe, as he would have appeared on his many expeditions. This will be displayed in the Piopio Settler's Museum when completed, with photographs of local landmarks relevant to the history of our surroundings. It must be noted some of Reischeks' spellings of place names are subject to correction so allowance has to be made.

Reischek spent 12 years in New Zealand from 1877 to 1889 and returned to Vienna with a collection of 14,000 items many of which are still held in European museums.

Recently I have been reading his classic autobiography - Yesterdays in Maoriland, New Zealand in the 1880's as well as Michael King's biography of Reischek The Collector, published in 1981 which gives a view of the explorer from different angles. The controversy arises from the unauthorised removal of material by him after having gained the trust of the Tangata Whenua.

When Reischek left Austria in 1877, he had just recently married but promised his bride to return after two years; however it was another twelve years before he returned to her, still waiting for him. By now she was forty three, but two years later gave birth to their son also known as Andreas. Unfortunately he was not able to sell his collection for anything near the value he put on it and died at the age of fifty seven in obscurity, after working in a local museum as a taxidermist and general worker.

From an extract from "Yesterdays in Maoriland", "...it appears that after spending some time in Mokau, Reischek and a son of the chief Hemera te Rerehau left for a journey on horseback through the Herangi range over to the Mairoa

arriving in the evening at Te Miro-a-huiao (Piopio). Hemera himself conducted Reischek around the area and on the 8th April he left via Mangawhanga and Kahuwera, and after further visits to villages on the way, arrived at Otorohanga and Te Kopua on the 11th and 12th April respectively. After this trip he spent some time around Pirongia before leaving this

area of the North Island."

Peter hopes this project will be of interest and that visitors will be encouraged to view the Piopio museum when



enjoying other attractions locally.

IOPIO **RESERVE PROJECT**

OUNCIL UPDATE

Much has already been said about the turn out we had for the ANZAC service in Piopio, so I'd just like to say a big 'thank you' to those who helped organise it and those who took part; you've done our little community proud.

Construction has now started on the new Piopio toilets with the construction crew being part of the team that has done the first stage of the Railway Building upgrade. No local tenders were received for the job.

Apart from my local responsibilities as an elected Councillor I am also on two Waikato Regional Council (WRC) run committees.

One of those is the Waikato Speed Management Group, where I represent Waitomo and Otorohanga Councils.

The aim of this group is to 'achieve a

regionally consistent approach to speed management', and my committee of eight is made up of Councillors, NZ Transport Agency (NZTA) staff, Police and AA representatives. This group is backed up by a technical team who are providing the technical advice and oversee the project work-streams.

This project is the result of the Governments Safer Journeys - 10year strategy, to introduce a safe system approach to reducing death and serious injury on our transport

The Speed aspect is split into; excessive speed, inappropriate speed, PH 8778033 and impact speed and getting uniformity over all roads nationally.

We have a variety of road environments and associated speed limits, basically as a result of all the different Road Controlling Authorities (District Councils and NZTA) that have set their own speed limits. The new One Road Classification is working toward reducing that variation also.

Police evidence has shown that a reduction in average speed of 3kph can reduce death and serious injury by 30%.

This project is just getting underway, and you can all do your bit by making better decisions while you're behind the wheel.

I'll keep you updated as this project progresses.




