Curious Keas Celebrates 10 years!!

It feels like only a year or two ago that Curious Keas opened its doors to Piopio's Preschoolers, parents, whanau and community, I have been running some numbers and we have had 445 children, and 405 families enrol in that time. Our oldest children are in year 11 in their schooling journey, it has been so special to watch this as being a small community we get to see them as they get older and watch them develop. I have said to several of my staff over the years that if they ever need a boost in confidence go down to one of the schools (Aria, Piopio primary or College) and all of our Keas children come and say hello or run up and hug

We still have 4 original staff members, dedicated to the care and education of the children in our community. Building relationships and getting to know the children and whanau are the foundation to learning at any level, it is key to promoting a positive view and attitude to life long learning. Having fun, being positive, a sense of humour, and a passion for children are some of the most powerful qualities in teaching at any level.

When we began our adventure of setting up, as a new business we worried that we may not get enough children to remain viable. Less than a 6 months later we increased our licensed space from 30-35, and within a year carried out further alterations to increase licensed space to 40.

Curious Keas will be celebrating this significant milestone with our children, their caregivers and staff, we have plans of 10 days of celebrations whereby we will have a celebration each day for 10 Days beginning on the 21st of march and ending on the 1st of April. I always wanted to hold an open day and invite as many families/children back as possible and have a barbeque and aerial photo to mark the occasion but this is going to be

impossible given the current covid situation, this will have to happen when restrictions ease.

Education has always been highly regulated, but as with anything in the last few years everywhere you turn there are more rules and restrictions on how you operate. Trying to remain true to our ethos of risk taking, learning through cause and effect, trying different ways of doing things and seeing this as learning not danger or failure is always a juggle, but having a team that all feels like this is the best way that children learn allows us to find ways of upholding the rules without restricting children's play, confidence, and growth.

One of the things that I speak of often is how lucky our children are to grow up in our community. Children and their whanau arrive at Curious Keas already knowing many of the children and teachers so it really helps them with their initial settling and confidence to be away from whanau and home. We have worked closely with the schools to develop smooth transitions as the children move on to primary. By the time our children move on to school they have watched their friends go, they have met their teacher, visited the school, had opportunities like watching the production, joining for waiata, watching sport and attending pet day. We also share routines and rituals (karakia, waiata, and current learning strategies in learning phonics) we have mini cross-country, and Pet day as a way of introducing some of the things children will experience at school with the view of sending the children off more confident and ready for a new environment.

and ending on the 1st of April. I always wanted to hold an open day and invite as many families/children back as possible and have a barbeque and aerial photo to mark the occasion but this is going to be In more recent years we have had organised visits from school students and teachers to Keas initiated by the new entrant teachers as the children tell them all about it. This is something we

are really proud of as you can see that the schools also place great importance on relationships and knowledge of where children come from in relation to being ready and open to learn.

One of my favourite trips I have ever organised was a local trip around the area in 2014, the children were into inviting each other to their houses and explaining where they lived, which led to looking on maps and seeing where everyone lived. We decided to map out a route, and then booked a bus. The day came and we had organised some stops along the way. We went past most children's houses, and had invited family to put notes in letterboxes. This was an amazing adventure with so much learning and connection-with the children, their whanau, our staff, and our community and also our schools (our Keas kids thought they were so cool going on the bus like the school kids). I think Snow and June Nicol (from 3way motors) were just about as excited about it as I was, they have been so generous with sponsoring trips on the bus for our children and they see the joy the children get out of it, and the berry orchard asked to be the last stop and shouted all of the children an icecream. We have done many other amazing trips over the years but this is a prime example of how it takes a village to raise a child!

Our plan was to have an updated staff photo this week, but unfortunately we have several staff off work so that will have to wait until everyone is back on board!

We are looking forward to many more happy years in Early Childhood here at Curious Keas, to our past and present Staff, children, families and community we thank you for your support, and wonderful memories we have created here!

PAST PIOPIO GREAT: Eric Shortridge on his days in Piopio

Last December we recognised the passing of Dr Eric Shortridge, past Veterinarian from Piopio. He was 94 and the dearly loved husband of the late Betty Shortridge (nee Tatham).

From his time as a professional in Piopio to his family ties to the district for the rest of his life, we have been able to celebrate some stories from his past as a well appreciated person of influence in Piopio.

Piopio, for its small population, has been exceptionally fortunate to host Veterinarians such as Eric, who originally hailed from England and began work in Piopio on the 6th of October 1952. Piopio had a population of 300 when he was employed to start a new practice here, as a branch of the Te Awamutu Veterinary club. There were no Vet schools in New Zealand at that time, all vets were were sent to Australia to be educated up until 1964. During the early 1950s it was forecast that NZ needed 250 vets nationwide but there was only 217 with masses of vacancies- we were very lucky to have such a vet arrive in Piopio.

Eric had lots of stories from his time in Piopio, familiar to those that we still love now. Pig hunting and memories of being notably scary with his driving on the local roads.... Vet's still get cursed for their driving skills even in today's age!

From his notebook inscriptions after his emigration to NZ as a Veterinary Surgeon, he recalled Piopio having the small Dairy Factory and quite a lot of sheep stations. He was called to one farm, foaled a mare for the farmer, who had been struggling with it for a long time and from then on, the farmer thought he was a magician.

He gave talks at Young Farmers functions and at the Rotary Club in Tekuiti, he did a lot of equine work, including eye operations, pulling teeth and tricky foaling's. He stated at the time that he did more in his first few years in Piopio as a vet than he would have done in five years in England.

He instrumented the new Vet Clinic surgery which was completed in November 1952 and he remembered fondly his first New Year's Eve celebration in Piopio which was an out of this world 'fancy dress parade and dance', with impromptu concerts and Māori dances.

He told his children stories about his days as a Vet in Piopio. He told them he always drove quickly and people would get off the road or were even known to jump into ditches if they saw dust flying- they recruited from Britain or Europe, or knew the vet was headed their way. He also said the Lady at the telephone exchange could always tell people where he was because she heard and transferred all the

> He loved Pig Hunting and had a land rover he could get most places, a lot of the local area was bush and scrub that was still being developed. His friend Athol Watson, the local barber would get told where the pigs were being a nuisance (over a good haircut) so together with Athol's dogs and his vehicle they kept a lot of pests at bay. They always tried to carry out any pigs they caught as wild pork was very good meat and what they couldn't eat was welcomed by friends.

> In 1953 he was called to attend a lion in a travelling circus....from a distance! It was said the lion's mate in the cage nearby took a dim view of the proceedings.



He enjoyed the many outdoor activities Piopio and the surrounding district offered. He played tennis, went trout fishing, pig hunting (with Athol) and mountaineering. He was here when the new Memorial Hall was opened, in March 1954, and started the badminton club, with himself as President. After three years in the business, he handed over the vet practice to Harold Skyrme and moved on from our little district.



Councillors Update

In the last Birdtalk, I commented on the climatic conditions we were experiencing, and then on February 11 we copped a rain 'bomb', and an example of the damage incurred is evident at View Terrace in Piopio. The damage to our road network has been extensive. A full survey and rehabilitation costing should be completed by June, but a current 'ball park guesstimate' is \$10m to \$15m, and may have to include land purchase and some completely new road sections.

Fortunately for ratepayers, a subsidy rate of 95% has been confirmed from Waka Kotahi for the emergency work, but we will have to find \$0.5m to \$0.75m based on that 'guesstimate'.

All landfills in New Zealand have their carbon emissions measured, or assessed (for smaller scale ones like ours), and under the ETS have to purchase carbon credit units to cover those emissions. The cost of these units is expected to increase from around \$45/t this year, to around \$90/t for next year, and also the Governments Waste Disposal Levy is increasing from \$20/t to \$30/t, on the roughly 8000t of waste going into our landfill.

Our Revenue and Financing Policy (RFP) allocates the recovery of Waste Disposal costs as 60% Fees and Charges (User Pays) and 40% Targeted Rate (on every rating unit in the district). The Fees and Charges portion is met through the cost of Councils blue rubbish bags and transfer station fees.

After 15 years of service as CEO of Waitomo District Council (including

extracting the Council from the financial morass it was in in the mid 2000's), Chris Ryan has retired and we have appointed Ben Smit who was most recently CEO for South Waikato District Council, as his replacement.

Mayor Robertson noted this change in leadership in his March 3, 2022, article in the King Country News, and also stated 'I will be proposing a set of Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) for the Council's CEO to our governance body'. He went on to state '... governing bodies do not always set and monitor CEO performance effectively. In my opinion there has been a gap in this area at our Council for many years. We will remedy this'.

Mayor Mark Ammon instigated a CEO performance monitoring regime, facilitated by an HR Consultant. That regime of 6 monthly, and annual, performance reviews, and KPI reassessment, has continued up until Mayor Robertsons election in October 2019. Since that time, there have been no 6 month, or annual reviews, of the CEOs performance, nor, any reassessment of the KPIs previously utilised.

With Three Waters still a 'hot' topic, I thought mention of the Piopio Water Supply Scheme might be of interest. It comprises some 8.5km of various diameters of predominantly asbestos cement pipe, with large sections nearing the end of its useful life. Actual operational experience indicates poor pipe condition. Failure risk is increased

due to the lack of a 'rising main' direct pipeline, from the treatment plant to the storage reservoir, which results in pressure fluctuations in lower lying areas and is a cause of pipe failure.

Installation of back-flow preventers is programmed over the next twelve years at \$6k/yr.

The water take resource consent from the Kuratahi Stream expires next year and we've budgeted \$51k over the 2 years for its renewal.

The treatment plant capacity is 600m3/d, current demand roughly 309m3/d, peak demand is 527m3/d, while our consented water take is 450m3/d.

Annual asset renewal and replacement costs are about \$74k, and the dedicated rising main is costed at \$337k in 2025/26.

The implications of the new standards, and their enforcement, by the new water regulator, Taumata Arowai, have not been assessed yet in dollar terms, but are part of the reason for the Three Waters reform proposals.



Playcentre has always had passionate people like Lee which is one of the things that makes it such a valuable asset to our rural communities. The past couple of years has been hard on our local playcentres. We have struggled with new members particularly as we have moved in and out of lockdowns and various phases of Covid. We are now at a point where numbers are low and the future of Playcentre in our communities is uncertain. Both Piopio and Aria are always keen to share what we are about and give people in our community the opportunity to come along. So, I thought I would take the chance to share my playcentre experience.

I have been involved in Piopio playcentre for the last 5 years and have had my 3 kids coming through the playcentre system. For me, playcentre has been great in getting to know people and building a support network for myself in the local community. I am not from Piopio but married a local. My career in the agriculture sector involved lots of travel throughout the Waikato but I didn't know many people around here. When I had my oldest child in 2015 I found the transition quite isolating being at home all the time even though I have great family support. My decision to join







playcentre was just as much for me as for my child. The first few weeks or months were hard turning up to playcentre not really knowing anyone – I knew it would take time to settle in so I stuck it out – and I'm glad I did.

Throughout the last 5 years I have met many families in the community, and made some awesome friends. I now have a 'village' that I know I can call on for anything from help with something, parenting advice, or just someone to have a coffee and a yarn to. I have learnt so much about how children develop and learn. I have enjoyed the luxury of seeing my kids in a play environment with a range of other kids of different preschool ages. I can see them learning and growing through play, experiences and various social interactions with the other kids. I love having somewhere to do the playdough, paint, slime, clay, fingerpainting, body painting, and any other form of messy play that I don't want to happen at my house. My kids all love going too.

My eldest has been at school for 18 months with my second starting this year. I have found it so much easier having the network developed at playcentre that has transferred to school. Having other parents with school aged kids to ask questions and knowing parents at school events has made the transition to having a school

child that much easier.

The playcentre journey for me has been key in adjusting to being a parent, to have a 'village' to lean on, and to feel part of the community. Playcentre is all about kids learning through play and supporting families.

Playcentre is open in the school term with Piopio playcentre is located next to Piopio Primary school and is open on Mondays (9:30am-12 noon) and Aria Playcentre is located on the Aria primary school grounds and is open on Tuesdays (9:30am-12 noon). 
