Motor Mishap

Considering the 30-odd years the Mokau Ferry has been in existence, the number of mishaps occurring have been few indeed. One rather unusual occurred a few years ago, when the mail car driven by an individual known by the public as "Desperate Dan". This to his penchant for always "getting there" in a hurry. In running his car on to the punt one morning it went a shade too far so "desperate" put it into reverse gear and backed a bit. He forgot to change the gear again, so when upon reaching the other side of the river, he put his foot on the self-starter the car instead of shooting forward as expected, did just the opposite and shot back over the end of the punt into 14 feet of water. For a time things were only middling. Mail bags and other less important odds and ends were soon floating down the river and it required quite a lot of energy on the part of the ferryman and "desperate" to recover them. The car itself was hauled out at low water and hung up on a clothes line to dry. One lucky circumstance was that a lady and her daughter travelling by the car had got out of it just as it came to rest on the punt. They probably saved their lives by so doing.

A considerable time after the incident above a private car owner drove slap-bang through the punt as though he meant to do the rest of the journey without it. Vain hope? The hood of the car got caught in some of the gear on the end of the punt, and the car itself was thus prevented from sinking altogether. The driver managed to extricate himself and his two children from their perilous position., The wife however, being of more ample dimensions, could not get out so easily. The most she could do was keep her nose above water. The ferryman jumped into his dinghy and rushed to her rescue. The husband, from the deck of the punt, got hold of her head; the ferryman got hold of her legs. In their excitement the one tried to pull her up., the other tried to pull her down. A veritable case of "pull devil, pull tailor" ensued. The law of gravity, however, assisted by the ferryman, prevailed in the end, and the lady was safely landed in the boat. Upon reaching shore, and upon the wife walking to meet her husband, the latter fancied he detected something queer about her stature. Something he had not noticed before. Her head seemed to be higher up than it used to be, or her feet lower down. He was not sure which. However, upon application of a foot rule he discovered she had stretched fully 6 inches during the process of recue.



On the 9th of February a motor cycle rider was subject to road rage and was assaulted by a truck driver outside the Whitebait Inn, the truck driver was arrested and charged with assault.

Some problems are arising with long line use on the beach around swimmers and surfers. When you use a long line, remain with it, it is your responsibility to ensure that if someone is getting close to it that you notify them, if you launch the long line off the beach, ensure that no other persons are already in the water nearby. You are potentially culpable for any injuries or worse if you are reckless in setting your long line, use your common sense and be considerate, we have enough beach for all to enjoy.

In the last month, there were three reported crashes and two vehicles have been impounded in the area due to disqualification. Speeding tickets in Mokau are far too common. The 50 km zone starts at the 50 km sign, it ends at the 100 km sign, a common mistake. Please report bad driving, either to me or via *555 at the time.

Any help will be appreciated no matter how little. There are always activities or tasks that need that extra pair of hands.



From your Councillor

I haven't had further opportunity to sit down with the various staff that were handling the queries I passed on to them from the Ratepayers Meeting, due mainly to the demands of the Long Term Plan (LTP) budget process we are currently working through.

I have managed though to get a response from NZTA staff with regards to the new barrier opposite the entrance to the Tainui-Wetere Domain. Part of the email said; 'Since we widened before installing the barrier the seal width on this shoulder has not been reduced. We appreciate there may be a perception of less space due to there now being a barrier on the side of the road. However, given the relatively low traffic volumes and there being no issue with sight distances in this area, southbound motorists have sufficient time to react, and slow down to assess when it is safe to manoeuvre around anyone who is waiting to turn right into the Domain entrance or stop if necessary'.

'We appreciate that it can take time for people to get used to a change like this in their road environment. If you continue to have people raise concerns about this barrier installation and would like us to get in touch with anyone directly please let me know their contact details'.

Further to my comments last month regarding our Solid Waste Management budgets, another aspect has been highlighted from our LTP planning workshops, and that is that Solid Waste costs are forecast to increase substantially due to the purchase of NZU's to satisfy our Emissions Trading Scheme (ETS) obligations resulting from the operation of our Landfill at Te Kuiti. Previous Government policy allowed for us to only pay (buy units) for half of our 'assessed' Emissions, but this year (2017-18) we have to pay for 67% of Emissions, next year (2018-19) 82%, and from 2019-20 onwards we have to pay for 100%. On top of this, the price we have to pay for each (carbon) unit is increasing toward the current cap of \$25/unit (current price \$19/unit). This resulted in budgeted Carbon Unit costs of: \$176,000 for 2018-19, \$318,000 for 2019-20, and for \$324,000 for 2020-21. The three year increase equates to over \$31 per rating unit during that time and helps illustrate why it is so difficult for us to have 'nil' rate increases.

While Cathy and her team have been processing all the information provided to them at their meetings in Mokau, and other localities, they have also been reassessing the overall costs for our District Plan Review. The cost used in the LTP 2015-25 was \$2.4m for an externally delivered project. In early 2017 the opportunity arose to employ some very well qualified staff and the project delivery was moved 'in-house'. They have uncovered a number of deficiencies in the original project plan, and costings, so the revised cost is now \$3.95m, spread over five years.

All of these numbers have been included in our preliminary draft Financial Forecasts for the Draft 2018-28 Long Term Plan, and we have been having intensive workshops finalising the Revenue and Financing, which we did on 20 Feb. Staff will complete the draft Financial Forecasts on 23 Feb., complete all the Strategies and Policies on 28 Feb., complete the Consultation Document on 2 Mar., and Council must endorse everything for audit on 6 Mar. Audit will take eight days, then the Plan will be adopted for Consultation at the 27 Mar. Council Meeting, with 20 days consultation commencing 5 April.

There will be plenty for you to think about.
