# WDC gives grants to three groups

WAITOMO District Council granted \$16,000 in funds to three groups last month with the goal of 'helping the community help itself'.

During the second and final round of the council's 2013/2014 Community Partnership Fund (CPF), the newly formed Piopio Community Sports Inc received \$5000, Piopio Memorial Hall Committee \$7000 and Friends of Hillview \$4000.

The sports group applied for funding for repairs and maintenance to the Piopio Rugby Clubrooms, the hall committee will put their grant towards upgrading the Piopio Memorial Hall's toilets while Friends of Hillview plan to invest in a new transport van.

The CPF is part of WDC's broader Community Development Fund – a contestable fund focused on projects and programmes that contribute to the community's wellbeing.

With a total of \$25,000 to allocate in 2013/2014, the first round of funding closed in November with three applicants receiving \$8900.

The three groups were Aria Toy Library that received \$1700 towards exterior wall paint: Te Kuiti SPCA which was granted \$4200 towards the replacement of its animal ambulance and Piopio Playcentre received \$3000 for a shade sail.

Waitomo mayor Brian Hanna says the council is proud to support all the applicants who received funding in the 2013/2014 round of CPF alloca-

"In my opinion they are all worthy causes. It is an initiative that this council gives great thought to ensure we are doing all we can to assist community groups achieve their goals. And going by the latest round of funding, the support is going to a wide variety of groups and organisations that are doing great things in our community."
