# Young cooks to compete

FOUR Kio Kio School students believe they have the secret ingredients to wow the judges in next month's Maggi Intermediate Schools Kitchen Showdown.

Twelve-year-olds Bennett Sanson, Caitlyn Morrison, Phoenix Hughes and George Butcher impressed the competition's judges when they submitted their roast chicken and kumara couscous recipe earlier this year.

Now the 'mini masterchefs' will swap their classroom for a kitchen at Auckland's Seafood Training College on September 3, facing off against 11 other teams in the Upper North Island regional final.

#### PERFECTING RECIPE

But in order to present a perfect dish, that is both tasty and visually appealing, the aspiring chefs will first hone their culinary skills with help from teacher James White.

"When we first tried the recipe we forgot to do a few things like cooking the kumara," says Bennett.

"But we have two weeks to get the process right."

Phoenix, who claims to make "a mean macaroni and cheese", says they are all excited about competing, and hope to win the grand prize of \$5000 for their school.

This is the third year Kio Kio School has entered the nationwide competition which will be judged by Culinary Innovations manager Richard Brogan and chef Mike Lee from TV2's Erin Simpson Show plus a surprise celebrity guest.

### **FINALS**

The regional finals will be aired on TV2's The 4.30 Show on September 16, giving the young chefs the chance to showcase their culinary skills on national television.

If the Kio Kio team wins, they will then need to prepare a new recipe for the national final in Christchurch on September 16.

Lee says: "Every year the judging gets harder and harder as school teams step up the quality and creativity of their submitted recipes.

"It will be exciting to see the delicious meal creations the teams conjure up."
