TAINUI HISTORICAL SOCIETY

FOOTBALL Tukapa v Tainui Sub-Union

Taranaki Daily News 1 August 1924

Considerable interest is being taken in the curtain-raiser which is to take place at Pukekura Park tomorrow at 1.15 pm between Tukapa and the Tainui sub-union representatives. The Tainui district comprises our backblocks neighbours of Tongaporutu, Mokau, Awakino and Mahoenui. For some years past a competition has been carried on in this district under adverse conditions as regards roads, but lack of travelling facilities in the winter has precluded any interchange of visits with Taranaki teams in the past. This year, however, the district has formed itself into a sub-union affiliated with Taranaki and the first representative team to leave the district will meet Tukapa tomorrow.

The members of the Tainui team are quartered at the Red House Hotel. The team had a somewhat lengthy journey by horse coach from Awakino to Tongaporutu where they joined the motor bus, the road being very bad in places. Mr L R Jones is manager of the team and Bruce, the ex Clifton and Taranaki representative, is captain.

Tukapa 23 Tainui 13 Taranaki Daily News 26 August 1924

A scratch Tukapa fifteen journeyed to Tongaporutu during the weekend to play a return match against the Tainui sub-union. The result of the match was a decided win for Tainui by 20 points to 6. McManus scored for Tukapa and Ennis kicked a penalty goal. Warrigal, Bruce, Black and Dickson scored tries for Tainui and Crudis, whose goal kicking was exceptionally good at New Plymouth, converted every try.

The visiting team were given an enthusiastic reception by the settlers, whose hospitality is highly spoken of by the players.



BEYOND THE AWA IN CLIFTON

In the long-term plan consultation document was the proposed closure of the Tongaporutu transfer station. While it was accepted by many that the current set up of the transfer station was well overdue some improvements to meet current societal norms around waste management and recycling, there was an overwhelming response to council that closing the transfer station completely would severely limit options for our local community.

This topic was heavily debated among elected members and Officers have been instructed to prepare a document on future plans for waste management up here in the north. This document is due to surface at the next Community Board meeting on Aug 22nd. As I have not seen this as yet myself, I am unable to indicate what they are thinking, but in response I have scheduled the next meeting to be held in the Tongaporutu Hall so that all residents, and bach holders have the opportunity to listen and comment.

As soon as I get a copy of the report, I will get it out and about so that you can come with some information and forethought.

Next Community Board meeting is 2pm, Thurs 22nd Aug in the Tongaporutu Hall. Come along, show your support and let's try to improve waste services while keeping the transfer station open.

COMMUNITY MONTHLY GET-TOGETHER

"Gods Love for the World"

In 1 John 4 the apostle tells us twice that "God *is* love". Sometimes however the sharp edge of this is blunted by treating it as "God is *loving*". But what this does is to change it from something that God *is* in the very essence of God's being, into a mere *attribute* of God – something that God *does* as just one more thing alongside other things God might also do.

But John wants us to understand that the very essence of God's nature and being – the fundamental thing that constitutes the very core of God's God-ness – *is love*. Consequently, love is the core motivator that sits at the very centre of *all* that God is and does. And what this means is that God doesn't have some *other* motivator that sits at some deeper place within his being that is in conflict with his love, that might on occasions, displace his love.

But many people, including Christians actually believe this where on occasions they speak of God's love being trumped by some other attribute. "Yes God is loving; but God is also *holy*, *righteous*, and *just*" and on this basis they displace God's love to some secondary place. It is as if God being loving is accepted as a good starting point, but when it comes to weightier matters of holiness and justice God's love can be set aside to make room for other considerations.

But this is not what the Bible teaches. God *is* love and so there is no contradiction within God. The Psalmist records as he prophetically anticipates Christ in Psalm 85:10

Steadfast love and faithfulness will meet; righteousness and peace will kiss each other.

This means is that within the being of God there is no civil war going on between love and justice – or between steadfast love and faithfulness or righteousness and peace. And therefore, we should not think of God's *love* in light of the fact that we know that God is holy, righteous, and just – but instead we need to rethink God's *holiness*, *righteousness*, and *justice* in light of the fact that we know that God *is* love.

This change of thinking about God challenges the many things we may have learned about him. God does not use his love as some kind of *technique* to achieve some other purpose that represents a higher priority for God. "*God is love*" therefore means, that God loves us for no other reason beyond the fact that God loves us. God therefore respects our freedom and integrity and never manipulates or coerces anyone into any way of being they do not freely choose.

God is love. And in his love, he created all people in his likeness to be the recipients of his love and to share in this relationship.

... ON POINT ...

The journey so far in our battle to save Point Road has been long and hard going.

The Point holds a special place in the hearts of many families who have grown up holidaying and spending time in this beautiful area of Mokau, with the area being subdivided by the Crown for people to build holiday homes a long time ago.

At times the erosion has been a problem which, with every good intention the owners have tried to prevent or minimise.

Those of us who own these freehold properties have all bought their properties in good faith and have invested considerable time and effort in the growth and maintenance of the area. In 2006 we were granted consent by a Maniaroa Marae official, the late Aroha Terry, after she consulted carefully with her people. This was to include work to protect the sacred Urupa, while protection work was being done on our properties, at no cost to the Tangata Whenua. Good progress was being made, and had confirmed support from credible people. At that time, a resource consent was applied for by the newly formed Mokau Protection Society for this purpose, at a cost of around \$100,000. It was declined mainly due to a coastal engineering report recommending any work not be done, as they thought it would not last. Interestingly, a rival coastal engineering firm has recently completed another one which is in support of further rock wall work being done and reported that the early rockwork done has been effective in saving the area.

The main reason work has not gone ahead is due to views of a small group of people from out of the area who have chosen to interfere and would like to see us lose our properties and vacate the area, let the sea wash in and that would be the end of the Point as we know it. This would be very sad for property owners, fishers, whitebaiters, beach visitors, and all others that enjoy this special place, who see it as worthy of saving.

Interferences have halted any progress we could have been made in stabilising and protecting the Point for everyone, at this time, including the sacred Urupa which we all care about. They have also resulted in Peter Sole Transport being convicted of disregarding an abatement order.

At this point it would be appropriate to acknowledge and say thank you to Peter & Joanne Sole for the help and involvement in preservation of the Point and apologise for the actions of the people who sabotaged the process. The court saw fit to make provision for a \$10,000 payment be made to appease these people, as, after all it was always money they were after. None of them own any property on the Point.

The \$10,000 payment was then made by Peter Sole Transport to these people who were active and diligent in reporting his actions resulting in conviction - rewarding their efforts.

If Mokau lost Point Road, the heart of Mokau would be taken.

Local community support for Point Road is essential and Point Road residents plan to include interested people and the media at future meetings with Local Government bodies to keep our light shining, and progress going forward.

More Good News for Rural NZ

The creation by the National-led coalition of a Regional Infrastructure Fund (RIF) is welcome news and a significant step forward for the rural sector, promising a brighter future.

It is exactly the shot in the arm we need after years of neglect, during which our basic infrastructure was allowed to deteriorate, and much-needed projects that could have produced sustainable growth and prosperity for the provinces were either put on hold or cancelled altogether.

It's time to farewell years of neglect and welcome a new era of development and progress.

The RIF creates a 30-year pipeline for infrastructure work. This will provide a national view of projects being planned, offer an assessment of infrastructure priorities, and will be able to showcase a stable and secure pipeline of work to attract consistent investment in New Zealand.

A transparent 30-year pipeline will deliver more long-term certainty, enable more effective planning, and reduce project costs.

Its provision for Fast Track legislation will provide a foundational reset of how we consent and deliver infrastructure projects for New Zealand. And don't we need that? We all know it is hard to build things in this country. Consenting processes cost \$1.3 billion a year, and the time taken to obtain a consent has nearly doubled in the last five years. We will cut red tape and make building the big stuff we need easier to reduce our infrastructure deficit.

So, the RIF is a win-win situation for the provinces—on so many levels. And let's not forget that the announcement comes hard on the heels of last month's announcement by Minister Simeon Brown of a \$4 billion pothole repair and prevention fund.

There is a lot more to the RIF than I can cover here, and I recommend visiting <u>www.growregions.govt.nz/new-funding/regional-infrastructure-fund/</u> to find out more.

But, suffice it to say, right now, I haven't felt so good about the future of provincial New Zealand in a long, long time.
