Mokau Kohunui Marae upgrade

He Urunga mou, he wahi whakataa, he wahi whangai e te tinana mou,he wahi whakatau ngakau, he Paa mo ngaa Iwi katoa o Piopio.

In 2017 Mokau Kohunui Marae set about establishing a strategic plan with the help of Te Whare Wananga o Aotearoa and Community Waikato. Through this many families on March 16th 2020, and then was alongside the Trustees and Komiti put in place goals to future proof the buildings, grounds and infrastructure. Strengthening te reo and tikanga at the marae and bringing our people together were high priorities which included establishing a robust Charter and sharing information on the history of the marae. Acknowledging all those who built the marae, who moved

buildings and kept Mokau Kohunui afloat since the early 1920's was and is important so that we are able to move forward with the knowledge that we were upholding the mana of those who did that mahi before us. These wananga and hui were a turning point in the Mokau Kohunui Marae rebuild project which started delayed due to lockdown. The journey has meant Trustees of the marae have needed to involve their whanau in planning and consultation which has been great for us all to get to know each other and meet regularly for a project that is important to us. We are thankful to all those who supported and continue <u>parihaulage@gmail.com</u> if you know to support this project especially from Te Puni Kokiri and the

Department of Internal Affairs. After many months of mahi, our beloved Marae is reopening with some brand new features. Our rebuild included an updated ablution block with new bathroom facilities and also new septic and water systems. Our next project, will be using a recent grant from the Provincial Growth Fund for renovations, repairs and improvements to the dining and kitchen areas, the wharenui and grounds. This funding is also intended to help provide employment opportunities for whanau hit hard by Covid-19 so please contact





COUNCILLERS UPDATE

As a condition of our Piopio Waste Water Treatment Plant Resource Consent we are required to invite all the submitters to the original consent to an annual Liaison meeting in Piopio. This year 34 invitations were sent out but only one person turned up to join myself and two staff members.

There have been some minor breaches of our Discharge Consent conditions, but the Regional Council has been kept fully informed of all instances, what caused the problems, what solutions were implemented, and they are happy with our procedures.

The maintenance requirements for the switches and pumps on the properties where they are required continue to be relatively high and expensive; however the environment they have to operate in is highly corrosive. New technologies are now available but the cost hasn't yet come down to the level required to be a viable option, but the staff are confident it will before long.

For those properties that have the switches and pumps, please refrain



from altering the settings or pushing the buttons. Our staff have set them for optimum operation and every call out is very expensive and adds to the overall operational cost of the scheme.

As you may have read in the Waitomo News recently, speed on our roads is now a major focus of Central Governments National Land Transport Plan. Deaths and serious injuries from road crashes are not declining and speed, and lack of seat belt use, is seen

as having the greatest influence on the outcome of a crash.

Setting of speed limits is bureaucratically complicated and expensive presently, with NZTA responsible for State Highways, and City or **District Councils** responsible for their local roads. NZTA is setting up

a new simplified system for registering the speed limits proposed for each road, but national uniformity in the speeds chosen could be challenging.



What is the worst section of road you drive on regularly and what do you consider is the safest speed to traverse that section? I'd be interested to hear your comments.

Watch this space – proposed Waitomo District Plan

Waitomo District Council (WDC) has been reviewing their district plan over the past few years and we understand it is due to be released for formal consultation within the first quarter of 2021. Many farmers across the district received letters from WDC last year advising that significant natural areas (SNA) had been identified on their properties. Following feedback from Federated Farmers and in keeping with good practise, WDC provided the opportunity for landowners to discuss concerns and issues with regards to those sites and in some cases SNA boundaries were amended to more accurately reflect the 'on the ground' situation. That informal consultation was a part of the district plan review process. It was however only one part of the plan that is being reviewed. The rest of the plan, which will include controls over activities like farm quarrying, earthworks, vegetation clearance, fencing and building placement in the rural zone has not been released in draft form for

public feedback. It is worth noting that it is not only SNAs that have been identified for extra layers of control but also areas called Outstanding Natural Landscapes (ONLs). Federated Farmers understand that large tracts of pastoral farmland have been identified within these ONLs. Unfortunately, WDC are not undertaking the same informal consultation process for ONLs before the plan is made public. Affected landowners will need to wait for the release of the notified plan to see the full extent of those overlays and determine whether the proposed controls will unduly impact on-farm practices.

Federated Farmers policy staff have considerable experience working through these council planning processes and will be available to share this expertise with farmers when the formal consultation process begins. Now all we can do is give you a 'heads up' this is coming. When the details of the plan are released, it kicks off a process which can take over two years to compete. This includes time for people to provide feedback, in both written and oral form, give examples as to why or why not the

provisions are acceptable and provide alternative solutions if necessary, before decisions on the final form of the plan are made. So, watch this space, Federated Farmers will continue to keep you updated, and provide more information as to how the reviewed district plan provisions will affect you and your farming business along with what we will be doing on our members behalf. Succession Planning with Coach Approach Rural

Families involved in farming remain the backbone of the New Zealand economy, and are critical for the vibrancy of our rural communities. Additional land purchases and increased productivity have meant leadership, people management, financial and governance expertise are now essential skills required to run farming businesses profitably and sustainably.

*Successor(s) and their mother's frustration from inaction

Taking control by starting succession conversations with all family sooner rather than later creates choices, improves risk management, can maximise growth opportunities and can strengthen family relationships and unity.

Deferring these conversations until tomorrow reduces choices and often limits decisions to being about exit and sale, rather than creating sustainable family business options.

Coach Approach Rural have helped facilitate family succession planning for over 10 years, and bring a unique process, focusing on people first, and structure later, ensuring that everyone is heard.

Dani Darke, Partner with Coach Approach Rural is bringing this service to the King Country. Dani has a background in rural finance as an Agribusiness manager, and a deep empathy for rural people, and farming.

"An important

The World's Weirdest Xmas Traditions

Swedish Yule Goats

The Yule Goat is an old Christmas tradition from Scandinavia and Northern Europe. The goat is a Santalike figure sharing presents on Christmas Eve. Today in Sweden, large straw goats are erected in towns across the county. The village of Gävle has a famously unlucky goat, which has been burned down by vandals more often than it has survived since it was first erected in 1966.



The Yule Lads of Iceland

13 Icelandic Yule lads carry out the role of Santa Claus. One the lads visits children on each of the 13 days leading up to Christmas, and each lad has a different personality. Children place a shoe in their bedroom window each evening, and if they've been well behaved, the Yule lad visiting that night will leave candy or small gifts. The lads were once somewhat frightening, leaving rotting potatoes for naughty children, but their image has softened over the years.

Lucky Spiders in the Ukraine

In an old Ukrainian folk tale, a poor widow and her children found a Christmas tree growing in their yard but had no money to decorate it. They took the tree inside, and when they woke up on Christmas morning, a spider's web covered it. The youngest child opened a window and daylight shone on the web, turning it into silver and gold. In honour of this legend, Ukrainian people often decorate their trees with plastic spiders and webs. A spider web on Christmas morning is said to bring good luck.

KFC Christmas in Japan

Thanks to a 1970s marketing campaign, Japan associates Christmas Eve with Kentucky Fried Chicken. Apparently KFC got the idea from an expat customer who bought KFC chicken for a holiday party, as turkey isn't widely available in Japan. The company ran with the concept, marketing its chicken as a traditional meal for the festive season. Over the years, the idea has grown beyond a commercial campaign to become a firmly established holiday tradition.

Latvian Mummers

Amateur actors –mummers– dress up as animals like cranes, goats, wolves, bears or horses, or as macabre characters that symbolise death. The mummers must stay incognito, cover their faces with masks and disguise their voices to ensure that no one in their neighbourhood recognises them. They go from house to house to drive evil spirits away with music and traditional songs. Families welcome them into their homes and offer them food and drinks in return.

Italy's Present Witch

The witch La Befana visits Italian children on January 5, the eve of the Epiphany. According to the legend, she turned down an invitation from the Three Wise Men to visit baby Jesus in the manger, and quickly regretted her decision. The story says that she still flies around on her broomstick looking for baby Jesus and giving gifts to children to make up for her mistake. Children put out a glass of wine and some food for her.



Bolivian Chook Church Extravaganza

Christmas Mass in Bolivia is chook full of excitement. An old story has it that the night Jesus Christ was born, a rooster crowed at around midnight to announce the birth. In acknowledgement of this belief, Bolivians flock to church to celebrate Misa del Gallo, 'Mass of the Rooster'.



The Krampus

Krampus is a half-goat, half-demonic being with wicker basket on his back. This basket is quite unlike Santa's sack, however, as the mystical creature is out to fill his crate with badly behaved children and take them to the underworld. Cities have an annual Krampuslauf, during which men dressed as Krampus run through the streets carrying torches. Krampus parties are starting to become popular in the USA, with celebrations taking place in cities such as New York and Portland.

Norwegian Broom Hiding

Norwegians once believed that witches and evil spirits revealed themselves on Christmas Eve, and families started hiding their brooms, mops and brushes before going to bed on Christmas Eve so that the witches couldn't steal them. Sometimes, spruce logs are burned in the fireplace to prevent witches from coming down the chimney, and men occasionally fire shotguns into the air outside to scare off evil spirits.
