On uptake of this position his intention to enhance the students learning environment and to provide opportunities to all, has been a collaborate effort under his guidance and he extends his gratitude to all staff and colleagues.

On Friday 30 November a large gathering of friends, community members and colleagues met at the Piopio College Hall to farewell and acknowledge his many years of service to our school and community.

David, Gill', their children – Sarah, Tim and Peter (Mark could not be there due to commitments in Christchurch), along with their spouses and children were welcomed with a powhiri performed by the College Kapahaka Group and whaikorero by Mr Doug Ruki and Mr Kawhia Muraahi.

Items were performed by the Kapahaka Group then it was "catch-up" time for David and Gill' to circulate among friends from near and far keen to wish them well.

Formalities resumed for a while when I outlined a very brief history of David's career and highlights enhanced with photographs and recollections by Mr Brian Tegg, ex Piopio College Principal, of their many years working together. The Principals of Te

professional relationships he had maintained with all the schools in our district and good working relationship that they had personally enjoyed. Other community

On behalf of all who work with David, Mr Laurie Butler presented David with a Tokotoko (ceremonial walking stick) that he had beautifully carved to represent the journey through life relating particularly to David, his character and his work. This obviously meant a lot to David and he expressed this as he responded, saying that it would always be a treasured taonga in his family.

Mrs Sarah Tucker (nee Day) spoke fondly of her time as both daughter and student in David's classes and thanked him on behalf of the family for his commitment to both his family and his vocation. Sarah had prepared a beautiful book of memories that she presented to him.

We have amazing facilities available and our emphasis will primarily be on their maintenance; with room for ideas when other opportunities develop.


The domain is currently best known for its Rugby and equestrian activities and we hope that through working together we can keep growing these sports for our community, both young and

Aria's Amazingly Wet Raft Race


Guess what happened on Saturday 17th November in Aria? It rained.



this year and see what feedback is



On a positive note, support has also community to spend time at home preparing festivities, with some businesses also closing the Monday allowing a long weekend break.


We hope this is the best solution for the majority of the community and certainly welcome any feedback or assistance to plan this years parade.

Hoping to set an example for their children to show them the importance of an education, Brian enrolled at University and completed a Bachelor of Science in Geology and Computer Science, teaching


SCUBA diving to pay for his way through university.


