



DISTRICT NEWS AWAKINO

TDN 9/1/1915 (from our own Correspondent)

For a long time the children of Awakino have been looking forward to the advent of Santa Claus and their fancy dress ball, both of which brought much gladness to the hearts of the little ones. The last children's ball, held on the 1st January, fairly eclipses anything yet held in Awakino, already famed for the thoroughness of its social functions. The way the children turned out was really a credit to their parents and all concerned. Too much praise cannot be given to Mesdames McNeice and Avery for the great pains taken with the children. The grand march was really a pretty and pleasing sight. Half the proceeds are to be devoted towards the Belgian Fund, and although a great number of the residents were in the city "on holiday bent" over £17 was collected which goes to show that although it's a long way to Belgium our heart's right there. Towards the end of the ball Mr W.D. Thomson made a few appropriate remarks at the conclusion of which a flag was spread on the floor, and, to the strains of the "Marseillaise," and "God Save the King," over £3 was showered on the flag. Music was supplied by Mrs McNeice and Messrs Leech and Preston. Extras were played by Mesdames Briscoe, Christoffersen, and Avery.

Ngā Hapū o Poutama - Pānui

December 2019

Tēnā ra koutou katoa,

Snowchange delegates from Finland, stayed at Tongaporutu Pā earlier in the month as part of the Future Seas 2030 Conference in Tasmania. Their stay in Tongaporutu was the only stop in New Zealand, and we visited various environmental restoration projects within the rohe. Their other stopover was to the Djunbunji Land and Sea Restoration Programme in Northern Queensland.

'On The Wings Of The Raven', a documentary about the life and work of Finnish elder, photographer, author and environmental activist Eero Murtomäki had its New Zealand premier showing during the visit. A further viewing is to be arranged. Eero is namesake to 11 yr old Māhaki Eero Gibbs. He and his wife Rita were also part of the Snowchange Aotearoa/Australia tour. They were shown the Pascoe's Mangapepeke Valley. They were impressed and took multiple photos of the biodiversity within the valley and will be keeping a watching brief on the NZTA/proposed road issue.

As part of the environmental restoration programme, we have put in place a trapping programme for rats in the korora or little blue penguin colony in caves in the Tongaporutu estuary. Korora, along with New Zealand dotterel and other coastal birds have disappeared from a lot of places in Taranaki, our observations are that the rate of decline is accelerating, including here. However, the biggest threat to the birds nesting in the estuary are dogs. Ahititi School had a noho marae at Tongaporutu Pā with the focus on the korora colony, the white fronted tern nesting at the moment, and reef life. Its handy having a marine biologist available.

Poutama representatives attended a DOC policy hui focussed on iwi and hapu engagement. This is a result of the NgaiTai ki Tamaki decision in the Supreme Court in December 2018. In essence DOC have to give practical effect to the treaty principles. It's a positive step to ensure practical local input into conservation management. as the biodiversity values continue to decline. One of the kaupapa was legislative reform for marine protected areas.

We asked that management of the marine area be brought under one regime instead of the current shambles of a series of laws that were basically kneejerk reactions to political issues such as the Ngāti Apa decision.

POUTAMATANGA

As previously mentioned, an excerpt from Historian, Bruce Stirling 'Ngā Hapū o Poutama Customary Interests' historical report will be added to the pānui each month. We will use the paragraph numbering Mr Stirling uses in his report. Feel free to email if you are interested in having a digital copy of the report emailed to you. This extract is about property rights.

54. Poharama, like others of Puketapu, had connections to Poutama and these enabled him to move back and forth between Taranaki and Mokau in the 1840s. His Taranaki wife, Kataraina, was among those who signed the New Zealand Company's purchase deed for Taranaki in late 1839, when Poharama was still at Kawhia. By 1846 he was living at Awakino and Mokau among his Poutama kin, where his status was such that he and his brother (Te Mata) could not only disagree with but physically resist the Mokau rangatira Te Kaka in a dispute about a tapu put on the Poutama beach road between Taranaki and Mokau.

Water Conservation over Summer

Waitomo District Council asks all Mokau residents and visitors for their co-operation in conserving water over the summer period.

Conservation and small changes made in terms of how we use water in the home and at work will make a big difference. Residential water use including garden watering, puts extra pressure on Council's Water Supply systems especially when supply levels are at their lowest.

There are lots of simple things we can do around home to conserve water:

- Turn off the tap when it's not being used.
- Remind visitors and guests that water supplies are limited.
- · Promote shorter showers.
- Do full loads in the clothes washer and dishwasher.

- Use a bucket when washing boats, trailers, jet skis, kayaks, etc.
- If you have to water the garden, do it in the early morning or late evening to reduce evaporation.
- For cool drinking water, fill a jug and keep it in the fridge. Running water to cool it down can waste 10 litres a minute.
- Fix leaky taps and toilet cisterns right away a small, regular drip can waste hundreds of litres of water a week.
