#### SHEARING RECORD—THE 21 YEAR DROUGHT

A local shearing gang has broken the eight hour five-stand wool lamb shearing record in early January.

The Barrowcliffe gang included Golden Shears Junior and Intermediate champion Ringa Paewai of Dannevirke, who shore 618 lambs, Willie Hewitson, a former Royal Welsh Show senior champion from Woodlands (603), Aidan Copp of West Melton, Christchurch (586), Jock Macdonald, the only local and son of former World record holder and World champion Alan MacDonald (564), and George Parker from Kinston, South Australia (539).

Exceeding the previous record by a massive 528 lambs, the team were exhausted considering this feat and the high temperatures in the shed that day.

Hosted by Puketiti Station, the staff and supporters created a great atmosphere for such an event. A lot of work goes into preparing for a world record, the selection of sheep and shed was crucial.

The shearers started at 7am and did two-hour runs with scheduled breaks. Timing is key and early on in the day the boys were on track with a steady hand to help them through the heat.

Local shearer Jock MacDonald, follows in his fathers footsteps, Alan MacDonald (Mickey) whom has previously held the nine-hour solo lamb -shearing record in 1993 and also won a world championship title in 1994.

The turnout of 150 spectators visiting throughout the day, exceeded station staff expectations and many commented the valley would have never seen so many people at once.

Mark Barrowcliffe shares his take on the event after what he considers the 21 year drought.

Who would have thought that after a flurry of world shearing records set in Piopio area pre 1993 that it would be 21 years before they would again grace the shearing boards of this once sheep dominated area, and what where odds of the same family being involved? Pretty damn high I would say and with Jock Macdonald having the same second as his father in his pen, Bruce Marshall, and Debbie Macdonald in same roll but as a mum this time rather than a wife (not sure what roll would be harder) both easy jobs in my opinion? The scene was set.

Only a stones throw away from the famous Donnelly Woolshed that held all MARK BARROWCLIFFE the records pre 1993 sits Puketiti Station, the venue for our attempt on the eight hour five stand strong woolled lamb record of 2638. As Nicky's poem eludes to, the day went pretty damn well considering this was the first record attempt by all these five "shed shearers". Nerves dominated the night before as they did during the first run, but once the team settled into their work it was just a matter of eliminating errors, holding their job and making it as hard as possible for the next team planning an attempt!

Funnily enough the actual day record breezed by quickly, (although there may be five shearers that beg to differ). The fact that the day went so well speaks volumes for the efforts of Rusty and his crew at Puketiti Station, Mickey's mentoring, the Barrowcliffe crutching crew, the cooks Rangi Roycroft and Haylee Warren that feed over 70 people every 2 hours, all the shed staff on the day, overseer Craig Fagan, and Kevin Hall and Grahame Speedie's knowledge and guidance in having over 700 lambs ready every run, and finally our sponsors PGG, Rabobank and Otorohanga ITM.

Under all these people were many more, so cheers to the whole team for making our day a breeze.

For the team of Jock Macdonald, George Parker, Willie Hewitson, Ringa Paewai and Aidan Copp with runs of 731, 728, 723, 728 and a new world record of 2910 the day went well, so is there more to come? Well maybe!

It also means that the Fire Ban is now in force, until, at this stage, the end of March. That date is of course subject to review, depending on weather conditions at that stage.

For those of you that have travelled SH3 to Awakino over many years, you will remember how the road at the Awakino end of 'Ladies Mile' used to follow on the southern side of the Awakino River under the cliffs, whereas the road now cuts across the bend in the river via two substantial bridges.

A local resident, Graeme, has recently put a lot of time and effort into reopening the old roadway and now has a beautifully mown walkway along the river bank, past a number of whitebait stands, with good parking areas at both ends.

It is not currently signposted, but is well worth a short break from driving, to have a walk along it.

On the administrative side of Council, Staff and Councillors are churning through the development of the 2015-25 Long Term Plan. Recent legislative changes have imposed big changes to the previous process, so instead of us preparing and presenting a 'draft plan' for public consultation, we are now required to prepare a 'Consultation Document', and this will provide the basis of community engagement, and must reflect the proposed content of the LTP.

It should provide for the key aspects of the proposed content, be clear, concise, and easy to understand, and reflect Councils judgement as to key matters for the community to consider.

All the supporting information that the Consultation Document is based on will be available on request. This is the 'heavy' stuff; financial statements, planning assumptions, service levels, infrastructure strategy, and financial strategy.

These documents will be adopted for audit at the 24 February Council Meeting, and adopted for consultation at the 24 March Council Meeting, with the consultation period being the month of April.

The development and preparation of these documents is a statutory requirement, and places a huge demand on our Staffs' time and resources. This plus the audit costs a lot of money for which ratepayers could claim they see little or no benefit, however this is the way that Central Government ensures there is 'accountability' in the process.

When the documents are released for consultation make sure you grab a copy and spend the time to read it. If something is not clear to you, don't hesitate to get in touch and I should be able to help you. Also, get in touch if you think there is something important to you that you think we have overlooked.

### COUNCIL **CONSULTS WITH** COMMUNITY



#### Recycle, reduce, re-use and save

Council provides rural waste transfer stations in the communities of Marokopa Kinohaku, Piopio, Benneydale and Mokau so that residents can conveniently dispose of household waste and recyclables, in an environmentally friendly manner

The transfer stations are supervised by staff to ensure the facility is used properly and so that maximum recycling is achieved.

Residents can recycle plastics, glass, paper/cardboard, tin and aluminium cans - at no cost. Other items like unofficial rubbish bags, white ware, televisions, will incur a the transfer station and Waitomo District Landfill.

The average cost to purchase a black rubbish bag is \$1.00 but to dispose of this type of bag at a **transfer station is \$8.00.** WDC blue rubbish bags cost \$2.60 and are **free** to dispose of at the Landfill and transfer stations. We encourage residents to use blue rubbish bags to dispose of household waste that cannot be composted or recycled.

Being aware of the cost of a rubbish bag is an incentive to use the bags more efficiently

and to make the most of the recycling facilities available within our communities.

Dispose of the following household wastes in a blue rubbish bag: Plastic food wrap, wax coated paper, used tin foil, potato chip bags, polystyrene, sanitary items, plastic types 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 - these plastic types are not accepted for recycling.



Recycle your household plastic (types 1 & 2) - milk bottles and plastic food / drink containers. Aluminium drink cans, clean aluminium plates/ trays, rinsed food tins, empty aerosol cans. Brown, clear and green glass and any rinsed glass bottle or jar that contained food or drink. Clean egg trays/cartons, cardboard boxes, newspaper, plain paper, envelopes.

The 2014 waste audit showed us that **36%** of the contents of rubbish bags was organic waste. Reduce the amount of waste going to Landfill by composting vegetable and fruit scraps, coffee grounds and filters, tea leaves and bags, lawn dippings, shredded paper/ cardboard, egg shells, breads, grains and pasta, plant clippings, flowers

## ROAD SAFETY TIPS

For students riding in the car, cycling, scootering or walking to school.



Driver's are responsible for ensuring that all passengers under the age of 16 are correctly restrained. **Keep primary school children** seated in a booster seat (in the back seat of the car) until they are **148cm** tall. School students and pre-schooler's are 59% (less likely to be injured in a crash when they are securely seated in an approved child restraint.

Turn off your devices and remove your earphones when crossing the road, and stop walk-ing if you need to make a phone call or send a text message.

When using a pedestrian crossing, check that any approaching vehicles have seen you and can stop before you step out.

Always wear a safety helmet when cycling, scootering or skateboarding to school to protect your brain. For cyclists, wearing helmets reduces the likelihood of a severe brain injury by 74%.

Stop, look and listenat driveways. Just like when crossing the road to make sure there are no cars exiting the driveway.



#### DRIVERS WATCH OUT FOR CHILDREN ON THE ROAD...

**Double check those** crossings and intersections. Children can be hard to see in between parked cars. Take care in high pedestrian traffic areas and make sure the road is clear of children. Slow down at school zones at all times and even on weekends.
