Ruth Park: The King Country's Forgotten Heroine

Ruth Park, the bestselling New Zealand born writer, grew up in the King Country and spent her childhood in a house on Nettie St, Te Kuiti. She doesn't have a bronze statue on Rora St, but you can find her in a small display at the Waitomo District library.

Park, who died aged 93 in 2010, was born Rosina Ruth Lucia Park in Auckland in 1917, an ancestor of the explorer Mungo Park. Her mother was of Swedish background. Park's father, known as Mera, came from Scotland. His job -building roads- took him to the King Country where he built, among others, the first graded road out to Kawhia. Mera had respect for, and a strong interest in, indigenous language and culture, an attitude his daughter Ruth shared. She wrote threedimensional Maori and Aboriginal characters, not common in white writers of her era.

After training as a journalist, Park moved to Australia in the 1940s and married the writer D'Arcy Niland. She wrote her most famous book, The Harp in the South (1948) while back in New Zealand on holidays, visiting family in Te Awamutu. The novel depicted the fictional poor, Irish Catholic Darcy family and their lives in the slums of Sydney's Surry Hills. Hugely successful in Australia, The Harp in the South was translated into 37 languages before being adapted as a television series in the 1980s. The novel launched Park on a writing career that lasted well into the 1990s. Two of her early novels were set in a fictional King Country town.

Park wrote prolifically for radio and television; for children as well as adults. *The Muddle Headed Wombat*

was her most famous children's character, *Callie's Castle* her most popular work of teen fiction. She received numerous honours, including the 1993 Lloyd O'Neil Magpie award for services to the Australian book industry. She was made a member of the Order of Australia in 1987. *Playing Beattie Bow* won the Australian Children's Book Council book of the year award, and made her famous in the UK as well as Australia and New Zealand.

Her novel Swords and Crowns and Rings won the 1977 Miles Franklin

Award. Park's last books published included a two-part autobiography *A Fence Around The Cuckoo* (1992) and *Fishing In The Styx* (1993).

A Fence Around the Cuckoo is set mainly in Te Kuiti in the 1920s, where Park attended St Joseph's primary. Seventy years later, Park recalled the sound of the underground streams below the school playground, and the rumble of Mera's International truck driving home down Awakino Hill.

She lived through the start of the great depression in our district, when farmers famously sent their stock to the works and got a bill instead of a cheque.

Work to improve the Tui Park Camp Ground begins mid-October 2019. Our aim is to manage the growing demands that tourist activity has on our core infrastructure and environment, and to ensure that visitors to Piopio have an enjoyable experience and have access to safe, clean and attractive facilities.

This project will include the installation of a small water heater in the communal kitchen area to provide hot water for washing dishes, and power connections on either side of the communal building. Work to clear the drains, maintain the front road-side fence and plant additional trees is also planned, in partnership with the Piopio Trust Committee. An upgrade of the ablution block will involve installing a toilet, hand basin and shower facilities and these will be wheelchair accessible. The ablution block will be fully repainted, and the current cash box will be replaced with KiwiCash technology which provides a secure, easy payment system for the bathroom and kitchen facilities.

MUSEUM CURATOR STEPS DOWN

Piopio stalwart, John Petre, has recently called time on a 25-year stint as Chairman of the Piopio and District Museum Trust.

During this time, he has made a huge contribution to the development and maintenance of this special community facility.

In fact, he has been involved almost from the outset of the first public meeting in April 1985 which set in motion the formation of the Museum Trust. This unique museum is centred on the blacksmith premises which was run for many years by well-known local character, Bill Glasgow, until his retirement in the 1970s. Also on site is Bill's small house with its basic standard of amenities which were common for its time.

Under the initial chairmanship of Wally MacDonald and soon after Maurice Robertson, with the help of John and many

others, the Trust acquired and shifted two redundant local buildings on site to house exhibits. The first was the former Presbyterian church and the second the former BNZ building. Later a slab whare was acquired and is displayed as a pioneer's whare.

John has also been heavily involved in some off site initiatives such as organising access to the Whakatumutumu Mission Station at the 8 Mile, constructing the Mangaotaki Bush Walk, signposting the many country school sites throughout the district and he was involved in the recent effort to secure and display the replica Model T school bus in Piopio.

John's experience and expertise will not be wasted. He is still a member of the Trust and will not be allowed to put his feet up for too long!

RAUPUHA STUD AND NATIVE NURSERY

We seem to keep ourselves busy down in Mahoenui; here's an update from the last year. Our on-farm Ram sale in November was another great day with a total clearance of rams and we were able to donate just over \$7000 to Farm Strong (supporters of mental health in the rural community). Thank you to everyone who supported this.

Our Bull & Heifer sale in May went really well with only one bull not selling and a total clearance of heifers. We fenced off another 12kms of waterway with 8 wire fence. We are in the process of planting it all up with Mavis' Native plants she has grown from seeds, these she has sourced locally. Mavis has now set up to sell them with some successful sales this year.

At present we are right into calving with cows calving to a couple of ______

with cows calving to a couple of new AI bulls, this semen we brought in from Australia. Unfortunately, it will be a couple of years before you really see if we got it right, but that's how it goes with stud breeding. Ewes are flat out lambing after a very average autumn down in the valley, hopefully the rain stays away. We have just started a trial with 84 2th rams and put them into an Agresearch Trailer, which records the amount of methane they produce after



25mins & 50mins. They have all been in once and have to go in again 3 weeks later. It is very interesting stuff. We are unsure if it will work but if we don't try we don't know. I personally think we are wasting our time but watch this space, I have been proven wrong before! We have carried out our Ram Guard work for Eczema and have just dosed 56 Perendale & Romdale 2th



Rams at .57 which is higher than anyone else in New Zealand for both these breeds.

We have been acknowledged by the FE Gold group and can use the FE Silver logo in our advertising which is great.

Our Ram sale is all set down for Tuesday 19th November 12pm start.

Once again, this year we will do something different. We have a celebrity auctioneer coming to sell our first ever Beltex cross sold at Raupuha. At this stage we are going to raise money for a charity. Watch this space: it may be grow a mow for Raupuha sale day and we will donate some money to Movember. Keep an eye out for this.

Water is both a critical strategic asset and a source of recreation in New Zealand and we all know it must be abundant, healthy, clean and cost effective. While we encourage the constant improvement of our waterways, the recent proposals from the Government on Freshwater are shortsighted and destined to have perverse effects on our primary sector and wider economy. These wide-ranging proposals will limit the flexibility of New Zealand farmers to adjust to market conditions and change their land use. The effects of this would be far reaching and could restrict farmers from innovating, which is one of New Zealand's key advantages. This means that farmers looking to be on the cutting edge of the market and transition to new crops will be hamstrung and unable to make these transitions.

Marlborough once used to be covered in arable crops, sheep and cattle, but due to New Zealand's flexible land use farmers were able to convert to grapes as they saw market opportunities present themselves. Now Marlborough is famous for its Sauvignon Blanc. The Government's proposals will severely limit farmers' abilities to make these changes and ultimately our primary sector and economy will suffer as a result.

The only conversions being supported by this document is the planting of more trees. Modelling in the document suggested 68 per cent of drystock farms in the

Waikato/Waipa area would be converted into forestry as a direct result of the proposed regulations.

This is heaping pressures onto a sector that is already at historically low levels of confidence. Despite the mounting pressures in the rural world, the Government has failed to even analyse how much these regulations will cost farmers and the wider economy. Once again, this Government appears content to treat our farmers like New Zealand's cash cows and have little regards for their own wellbeing. This document piles more uncertainty onto the sector, and many will be struggling to see a way forward.

National established a comprehensive National Policy Statement while in Government and worked alongside our primary sector to clean our waterways, which have been steadily improving, as shown by the Government's own data from

Land, Air, Water Aotearoa (LAWA). This analysis of national river quality trends from 2008 to 2017 showed that for eight out of the nine water quality indicators reported on, more monitored sites were improving than degrading. A large part of this consistent increase in quality is the huge amount of work farmers have already

done to improve water quality. We signed an accord with the dairy industry that has seen farmers fence off 98 percent of their waterways, a distance of Auckland to Chicago and back, alongside spending over \$1 billion in environmental investment over the last five years. This is a major achievement from our farmers but not a story David Parker wants to tell. It's outrageous that the Government seems hellbent on putting more and more shackles on the sector that produces 60 per cent of our exports and is the backbone of our economy. If we want first world healthcare, transport and education, we must sell something to the world to afford to buy our first world affluence. This means we should be encouraging sustainable growth for our industry, not stifling it with regulations in the name of political ideology.

Great news for KCRC this month with a very positive response to our first external funding application. Waikato Regional Council (WRC) have agreed to fund \$30k with a possible top up of an additional \$10k. This is funding towards coordinator wages and helping KCRC achieve our goals.

Not such great news is the governments "Essential Freshwater" reforms package. Whilst we, like all NZers want healthier waterways, how (& how fast) we get there is harder to agree on. This is going to be really important for us all to have our say & KCRC will do whatever we can to help you all do that. Submissions close on the 17th October so please get in touch if you need help. KCRC have made great progress with an MPI funding proposal for the next 3 years. Basically this is part of the government's \$229m package to support farmers &

rural communities adapt and respond to changing regulations and requirements. Officials from Wellington are visited on 18 September, they are very keen to provide us some funding and we are in the process of working through the finer details.

Big thanks to farmers for taking the time to attend our events, and our partners for delivering workshops over the last few months. WRC have supported us with seven Risk & Mitigation days, with just under 150 attendees. We have held four Beef + Lamb NZ FEP (Farm Environment Planning) workshops recently with around 10 farm businesses attending each of these. We are looking to keep improving the workshop format to help these days provide real value for farmers. We are planning to hold a "drop-in" follow up day for farmers who have started their FEP and would like some help with further work on it.

The proposed date is 22 October in Piopio - let me know if you're interested.

KCRC attended a Significant Natural Area (SNA) stakeholder workshop in Te Kuiti on 20 September. Many farmers in our area will receive a letter next month regarding the process Waitomo District Council is following to help landowners identify if they have SNAs or Landscapes on their property and what this means in the future. If you receive a letter it is in your best interests to make sure you follow up on the actions suggested. WRC have Hill Country Erosion funding available now in the Mokau & Awakino catchments for riparian fencing/planting (small budget, and only for 2019/20), poplar/willow pole planting, retirement of LUC class 6e, 7 & 8 land with high erosion risk (with or without indigenous bush), and some farm planning.
