in Piopio and Warrick & I have been busy preparing to open our new tourism venture, Hairy Feet Waitomo. Due to the confidentiality of the film, we haven't been able to talk about all the interesting things that went on during their time here, until recently. Keeping quiet has been difficult for us all but almost impossible for Warrick, as he does like to tell a story or two! However, he did manage to keep things under wraps luckily and is making up for lost time now. Even our boys, Peter & Matthew have found the task tricky, nearly earning detentions at school for appearing to be off-hand and surly when questioned about what was going on up the Valley. Really they were

trying very hard not to mention anything!

For those of you who have seen *The Hobbit: An Unexpected Journey,* the Mangaotaki Valley starts its debut at about 55 minutes, in the spooky Trollshaws Forest. Several pivotal scenes were filmed here, with dwarves, wizards and a wee hobbit running around underneath our cliffs and through the rocks and bush.

Lots of clever computer graphic work made the three hardcase mountain trolls, the huge wargs (wolves) and sleigh rabbits come to life on the screen.

The whole piece lasts about 20 minutes, with 6 minutes 30 seconds of actual location footage. This is major airtime I'm told and we have the honour of having the most screen time of any location in the whole movie!

I know a lot of you had something to do with the film's production. You may have rented your house to help accommodate the 500 cast & crew. Possibly you supplied goods & services, or you may simply have chatted with them. Whatever you did, they really enjoyed their time in the Piopio area. The positive comments about Piopio's country hospitality and willingness to help-out has travelled far outside New Zealand.

Tourism NZ is also excited for our area, as they hope to see more opportunities opening up, especially bed & breakfast accommodation.

So, what are we going to offer with Hairy Feet Waitomo? Daily, personally guided tours through the areas used in the film, while getting to see a geographically unique landscape. We hope to attract the avid Tolkien fan, movie buff or anyone interested in experiencing native bush and unusual rock formations in this beautiful valley.

We plan to be operating by late spring/early summer, in

time for the next film, *The Hobbit: The Desolation of Smaug* which being released
mid December.

It may be hard to fathom why Tolkien fans travel from all over the world to New Zealand to visit the film locations used in both *The Lord of the Rings* and *The Hobbit* Trilogies. But for a lot of travellers it's a place of reference.

"It's a big deal, as many have studied Tolkien at school or university. In America", Suzie recalls "The Hobbit is the second most read book next to The Bible and I think in the world it's fourth, which tells you there's something there that makes people want to read these stories.



Beef Lamb New Zealand **Demonstration Farm Fielday** in Aria

On 31st May Blair and Anna Nelson hosted 75 farmers and agri-business people at a Fielday on their farm in Aria. This was to showcase the progress made so far as BLNZ (Beef and Lamb New Zealand) Demo farmers after

16 months participation in this new BLNZ programme.

The objectives of the Nelson Farm project are to improve farm gross margin by \$200,000 annually by increasing gross margin per hectare from \$700/ha to \$900/ha. This will be achieved by improving feed supply/demand decisions' and by improving feed quality to lift performance of multiple ewes (higher and more even lamb weaning weights) and summer lamb growth rates through establishing a high performance area - currently plantain.

Erica van Reenen, Extension Manager BLNZ says "The **BLNZ Demonstration Farm** Programme will showcase innovation and put new science to the test. Demonstration farms are intended to showcase a narrow category of farming activity rather than taking a whole-farm approach. For example, a demonstration farm may be forage-specific, or production-specific by either sheep or beef. The programme is aimed at farmers who want to help identify tools and practices that will result in real financial improvements. Demonstration farms are

Shaun will be racing riders from all through out the world in the 11 year boys 20 inch competition on the 24th July

Shaun is currently training 6 days per week which is made up of 2-3 days at the

Well We are more than half way through the campaign. Five more weeks until we leave for Austria.

Recently we had the winter series. This is a regatta where we race the other N.Z teams over 2kms. Initially we had to race the men's under 23 coxed four, Elite Womens Quad, Elite men's double, Elite men's pair and women s Elite eight. We were given handicaps so we were sent off 12 seconds ahead of everyone and then everyone else had their own set handicaps. We had a very good race crossing the line in first place closely followed by the Elite men's pair and the under 23 coxed four . Following this race we had a 12 km training row. This turned out not to be the smartest thing.

Saturday we had a hard row and it wasn't one of our best. We were tired from the previous day and instead of using the rhythm which is the strength of our boat we grunted it and didn't have as much finesse. We raced against the under21 men's lightweight double, Elite women's quad, men's junior coxed four.

Having learnt from our mistakes the

previous day, we made them our strengths in further trainings. We had the women's under 21 and junior quad, then seven seconds we went. Nine seconds after us the Elite women's quad and the men's junior coxed 4 went. We crossed the line first so we finished the regatta on a high.

We have **96.90%** prognosic for today. This is the percentage of our race time compared to the world record. Less that 0.37% covers the top 5 U23 crews - so we are all on track!

Crew Three -Taumatatotara West Rd. Whakapirau Rd, Mangaotoa Rd, Pomerangi Rd.

If your road hasn't been done and needs serious attention, please ring 8780800 and place a 'Service Request' with the receptionist, and they will log your message with the roading team. They can then arrange the work programme priorities without having to drive every

After a long dry autumn that section of our road network. So if you discover any new failures in the road surface, at any time, be it pot hole or slumping, please promptly lodge a service request and the problem will be bought to the attention of the roading team.

Piopio Public Toilets

The initial budget based on refurbishing the existing toilets was \$63,000, however questions were raised about sufficiency of size in view of rumoured usage. Counters were installed and approximately 14,000 people used them between mid January and mid February.

The statistics, if you're interested are:

Daily use varied with the main peak at mid day (about 25 per hour for men and women), a small peak around 6.00am (about 11 per hour each), and some usage every hour of the night.

Friday (1100 women, 1300 men) and Sunday (1200 women, 1200 men) were the peak daily uses, followed by Saturday (1000 women, 950 men), and Monday (680 women, 750 men). The other three days were around 500 of each sex, each day.

The current plan now is; Female – 3 pans, Male – 1

pan & 2 urinettes, Disabled/

Open

Monday - Friday

8am-5pm

Unisex – 1 pan plus Baby change table, nursing seat, and child restraint seat, and with a 44.4m2 floor area, against the existing 22m2.

The quantity surveyors costing comes to roughly \$160,000, plus design costs to date, other fees, and site completion of about \$13,000, less the initial budget, leaves around \$110,000 to be loan funded.

I was shocked at the price, however these facilities have to be built so as to be indestructible, unfortunately, and the costing is in line with other public toilets being built around the country.

Final drawings will be done, and the job put out to public tender in the near future, then we can look to further enhancing our reputation, with the travelling public, as a great place to stop.

Council Elections

Believe it or not, I've now been a Councillor for almost three years, which means Council elections are coming up again in October. Candidate nominations open on 19th July and close on 16th August. Candidates are announced on 28th August, and voting documents will be my ability. delivered over 20th - 25th

> September, with voting closing 12.00 noon, 12th October, and preliminary



announced that night.

I've found being a Councillor challenging at times (very different to farming), but also very rewarding. We've had a good team around the Council table, and our one employee, the CEO, has employed a good team of staff, who have managed to train five new Councillors to a good standard.

It has been a privilege to represent you, and I've been very impressed with the way our smaller communities work together. Over the last few years, Jenny and I have travelled through a lot of New Zealand, and despite the odd pot hole in our gravel roads, high rates, and the challenging financial returns from our farms, it's still a damn good place to live, amongst a damn fine bunch of people.

Three years on, and a lot more experienced, I have committed to stand again. If elected, I promise to represent you to the best of
