We're starting to get into that time of the year at the Community Stand when the contributions from our local veggie gardens and orchards tend to get a bit spotty. At least until the citrus harvest kicks in.

Lately veggies are moving out of the stand just as quickly as fruit. This hasn't always been the case in the past, undoubtedly now due to high produce prices.

So a freshly cut bouquet of silverbeet, spinach or beetroot would be appreciated if you have any surplus out in your gardens and are able to take the time. Even a bunch of rhubarb.

### Val hangs up her St John hat after 16yrs



LOCAL heroine Val Perry of Aria is retiring from ambulance duty after 16 years of volunteer service with St John in Piopio.

The story starts at a Lion's Club meeting when Ngatai Rauputu, who was managing Te Kuiti St Johns and also a paramedic, gave a speech one evening. Inspired, Val's husband Ken Perry -another local ambulance hero- volunteered as a first responder. After a few meetings, he asked his wife if she could come along to help him understand the medical terminology. Val had worked as a nurse before settling down and starting a family.

Val has never left St John.

Ken and Val supported each other for sixteen years together in the ambulance service.

"Being a first responder was different from a hospital setting but I enjoyed the challenge. I settled in with great ease and really enjoyed the service of helping those in need," says Val.

The two provided St John ambulance services all across our community, working everywhere between Taranaki and Hamilton.

Whenever the pager went off in the middle of the night, they were dressed and ready for any emergency. Who knows how many people owe their lives to Ken and Val's quick thinking and quality care?

Val decided to retire after having her second hip replacement.

"My fitness level was not where I felt it needed to be. I will really miss the company of my fellow officers and of being a service to the community."

Val will continue serving on the area committee.

### **Councillors Update**

hit in February is proving very challenging for our staff. The initial recovery programme, costed at \$17m over three years, was declined by our funding partners, Waka Kotahi, so intense discussions are continuing with them to find a reasonable and affordable solution.

This additional burden is also impacting our ability to complete this year's very large Capital Works (CAPEX) programme, to say nothing of the staff capacity and supply chain constraints we were already facing.

Our initially budgeted CAPEX for this year was \$10.35m, which was in line with previous years, to which was added 'carry-overs' from the 2021-22 year of \$3.40m.

The Three Waters Reform package added another \$1.19m, and this year's portion of the new Stadium build is \$4.96m. A further \$1.05m has also been added which included bringing forward next year's purchase of Carbon Credits, that will be surrendered to meet our Landfill emissions commitments. This gives a revised CAPEX budget of 20.95m, of which \$8.9m has been spent to the end of March. Of the remaining \$12m, staff are confident \$6m will be spent before 30 June, and the balance to be carried over to next year.

THE Cyclone Dovi weather bomb that ported in Piopio and they're not all from Councils pipes. If there is a leak on your side of your water toby, it is your responsibility to fix, and most of your pipes will be as old as Councils pipes, thus nearing the end of their functional life, and closer to failure.

> If anyone notices any water leaks in our villages, please notify Council immediately (07 878 0800 or 0800 932 4357), and if it appears to be from a private property, please alert the occupants.

> We will be looking to approving next years (2022-23) budget, and strike the rates for that year, at our next Council Meeting on May 31.

The decision is expected to result in a large variation in the rating impact on individual ratepayers, essentially as a consequence of the wide range in the changes of Capital Value after the recent revaluations. We have endeavoured to moderate the extremes of the effects, but we have no other options available to do more than that.

Local Body elections are being held in September and October this year, and Waitomo District Council will be continuing with three Rural Ward and three Urban Ward (Te Kuiti) Councillors, and a Mayor. Nominations will open on July 15, close on August 12, and postal voting will commence September 16 and close at 12 noon on Saturday, October 8, 2022.

### More cost of living relief for KC families

WE have just released this year's Budget, which sets out the next steps in our plan to build a secure future for New Zealand. In addition to the comprehensive cost of living package which will deliver for 2.1 million workers across the country, there are investments being made that clearly demonstrate that this Government values our rural communities

Further support in the form of \$31.6 million to help maintain and lift animal welfare practices across Aotearoa New Zealand and \$110 million to boost the biosecurity system and continue the Mycoplasma bovis eradication programme.

This budget delivers a real, practical food and fibre sector investment package of more than \$1 billion.

It isn't just the rural economy that is getting a boost. This budget also delivers a better quality of life for those of us

who live rurally.

Not only are we removing barriers to getting a driver licence, helping 64,000 Kiwis get on the road and into work, but also improving and expanding our air ambulance fleet with an additional \$90.7 million.

When you live in rural New Zealand and urgently need help from the health system you become acutely aware of how far away help can really be.

When the rescue helicopter flies over my house I am so thankful that there is an amazing crew heading to Mount Taranaki to help a tramper or to the back blocks to help a farmer.

This funding will help those awesome crews to better provide this essential service.

Of course, as we do this, we'll continue to carefully manage the books - and our careful fiscal management means we return to surplus quicker than National did after the global financial crisis.

This budget proves, yet again, that we back our farmers and provincial communities and are committed to providing the support needed to secure our future.

These are just a few highlights and there's a lot more in the Budget that will benefit people here in King Country and if you'd like to more, I'd encourage you to check out labour.org.nz/budget2022.

### **KC Rivercare Update**

THANK you to those who attended on-farm Field days in the last month; there's plenty more coming up with dates getting added to frequently. Hopefully there will be something of interest to you and your business.

Thank you to B+LNZ & Rural Support Trust for working closely with us to deliver many of these events.

We are looking to add dates for updating your Farm Environment Plan later in June and a series of Catch-ups with Freshwater ecologist Merrin Whatley in mid July to discuss in more detail the results and trends of our first year of water quality testing.

If you are planting this season please check in with your nursery to ensure your plant order is on track and maybe sort out some stakes to help find smaller plants in the following summer/autumn.

There is wide variation in survival of natives planted last year in our 1BT funded program - no surprises that north facing banks have generally struggled, however most projects appeared to have got close to the 80% survival target overall great work by everyone involved with close to 50,000 plants in the ground covering 30ha.

An additional 11ha was retired for native reversion and 5.3hectares of wetlands were restored. Over 25km of fences were built.

Thank you to all who completed the 2021/22 KCRC Farmer survey; congrats to the winners of a box of beer or a bottle or fine wine - Mark Verry, Ewen Smith and Tim & Mary Stokes, our randomly selected survey participants.
