### REMEMBERING MR B

When a team of locals – including popular teacher Bill Burnell – brought rowing into the College in the early 2000s, they couldn't have known how successful some of their graduates might become. Take Hannah Osborne, who won her Olympic silver medal in July. Our community was proud to say she'd attended Piopio College and that her rowing career began here.

Back then, Piopio people were determined that being in the King Country, away from suitable stretches of water, wouldn't preclude anyone from the sport. Rowing came to the College on a shoestring. Teams practiced at Awakino using old, borrowed and discarded equipment from other schools and clubs. Parents and teachers carted the boats down there in an old stock crate. Soon dozens of students had started rowing. The PRC (Piopio Rowing Club), although not an official club, first competed at smaller regattas around the north island – Te Awamutu and Clifton at Waitara. Later competition highlights included a gold medal at the North Island Club Championships at Karapiro for the Women's Novice Coxed Four.

Bill Burnell –Mr B– was among the community members who gave their time and energy to the project. He convinced many students to commit to the season and work through the resultant

tiredness, pain and blisters. He was their champion and encourager-inchief; excited on their behalf and determined for them to succeed to the best of their ability. He was always enthusiastheir ability.

One year the Piopio team travelled to Twizel for the Maadi Cup. Mr B flew to



Christchurch after his school day and, since he didn't drive, then hitchhiked the 285km to Lake Ruataniwha to support the team – just one of the stories showing his dedication to his students and to sport.

### **ABOUT MR B**

Remembered for his laughter, bushy beard, high socks, red jumper and yellow smokers' fingers, Mr B came from a family of teachers and devoted his life 64. to education. He sincerely believed in every student –especially the

'challenging' ones- and worked tirelessly to reach them. He encouraged them to test themselves to the best of tic and full of support, even when he was new to the sport of rowing and he himself was learning. He was always full of advice - both sporting and life advice.

As a teacher he saw no reason to confine learning to the classroom when outside the school grounds there was a far richer learning environment. He organised annual treks over the Tongariro Crossing, study camps at Kawhia and outdoor education at Gribbon Road in Mahoenui.

As well as rowing, he loved cricket and was talented at the sport. 'It's not hot here, it's hot in India!' was his catchphrase when students complained about the summer heat. In the classroom, cheeky students tried to get him talking about sport - whole periods occasionally disappeared in that fashion.

At his home, along with his wife Dot, he greeted all guests with generosity and story-telling. He was a mentor to other teachers as well as to his students, and is remembered fondly by many in the community. He died in 2015 aged

### **BURGLARS ARE BACK**

Take a photo or write down the vehicle registration, date and time, and forward to me.

### Piopio Dental, Rural Women and A Tale of 2 Pandemics

In November 2019 I was at the Beehive in Wellington attending the Rural Womans New Zealand Business Awards. It was quite a different setting to our usual day to day life in Piopio! Piopio Dental had won the Health and Wellbeing section of these awards. The sponsor for this section was Access Community Health.

Access Community Health is a provider of home-based healthcare and support. It was originally started and owned by Rural Women New Zealand, and formerly called the Women's Division of the New Zealand Farmers Union. In 1927 Rural Women New Zealand launched the Bush Nurse and Emergency Housekeeper Scheme. The aim was to try to reduce the hardships, loneliness, and improve the health, of women living in rural back blocks.

Sitting in the Beehive I felt quite embarrassed, I had no idea of this history of Rural Women's or that my sponsor had such close ties to the organisation. As a healthcare provider this history aligned with our all-female Dental Practice in a small rural community. There was also however another twist in this tale.

In 1918 the Spanish Flu hit New Zealand. Historic records estimate around 9000 New Zealanders died in less than two months. At this time my Great Grandparents Kate (Gran) and Jim increasing air changes in a room, and

(Guggy) Tatham lived and farmed in Oparure. During the 1918 pandemic my great grandmother nursed and supported the neighbouring Maori family through the Spanish flu. The entire family survived. As a gift of thanks, the family gifted my great grandmother a Tiki. This Tiki has been handed down through the woman of our family since then. In 2009 it was handed on to me by my aunt. I was wearing the Tiki that night in Wellington 101 years on.

Who could have predicted, only a few months after these business awards, the world would begin to grind to a halt with our century's version of the Spanish Flu? During these challenging times I have reflected on my family history and the similarity of these 2 pandemics. What are the odds of a great granddaughter still living and farming in the district, whilst also providing a health service?


Like many small businesses in our area, we have struggled with the challenges Covid19 has brought us. We have adapted to the times to ensure that we are able to continue to provide a muchneeded oral health service in our region.

We have recently installed a Nederman suction unit to remove aerosols from our surgery during and after dental treatments. This unit changes the air in our surgery 11-13 times an hour. By

removing aerosols when they are produced, we are reducing the potential cross infection. As Covid 19 is primarily spread by aerosols we are greatly reducing the risks and providing better health and safety outcomes for our patients and staff.

Just like my great grandmother we are working hard to protect our staff and patients, and will continue and adapt and adopt new technologies to provide the best and safest care we can. Look after yourselves, your extended family and friends. We look forward to seeing you all at Piopio Dental.

Covid19 is a very challenging and rapidly evolving virus which has, and will, continue to change the way we live our lives. It is spread successfully by aerosols. Our world in dentistry involves a significant number of aerosols. In addition to our usual strict cross infection procedures, we have assessed other options to protect both our team and our patients.

There are other circumstances that can make you eligible. Talk to one of our local Skinny Jump partner Desiree 0278144663, at the Te Kuiti Community House Trust.




### Where can you get Skinny Jump?

The Te Kuiti Community House Trust, they will help you to sign up for Skinny Jump. They will also give you a modem and help you to create a Skinny account.







### **COUNCILLORS UPDATE**

The Governments, via the Department of Internal Affairs (DIA), Three Waters Reform proposals are creating a lot of uncertainty, essentially through a lack of easily understandable information.

My take on their basic premise is to ensure the provision of high, and consistent, quality drinking water to all New Zealanders, and substantially improve the water quality in New Zealand's waterways, estuaries, and harbours, by dramatically reducing the discharge of contaminants from wastewater (sewerage) and stormwater into those waterways.

Their intention is that four 'Entities' will be established and operating by 1 July 2024, across New Zealand, to operate the 'Three waters' in a manner that will achieve their environmental outcomes 30 years from now, 2051.

Councils are currently assessing how they presently measure up to the initial standards DIA have put out, how they will measure up in 2031 when their recently adopted Long Term Plan projects and expenditure are complete, and relating those to DIA's expectations. We will all then be in a position to provide feedback to DIA on their feasibility and/or practicality.

There is no requirement on Councils to make any decisions regarding 'opt in or opt out' at this stage. When the proposals get to the stage of Councils having to make decisions on asset transfers or whatever, full public consultation will occur.

The Three Waters Reform proposals are part of a complex legislative reform programme involving the replacement of the Resource Management Act, passing the Climate Change Adaption Act, finalising the National Policy Statements on Fresh Water and Indigenous Biodiversity, along with a Review of Local Government. I will endeavour to keep you up to date as the journey progresses.

### **Chair Report**

### KCRC AGM Sept 21st 2021

I'd like to thank the committee and our co-ordinators for giving their time and effort with KCRC. We have a wide range of experience and opinion on the committee which leads to good discussion. We have grown to three coordinators now so I would like to thank Anna, Jo and Robyn. Thanks also to our partners at MPI, BLNZ and WRC for their support, with both funding and expertise over the last year. Without their help we would not be able to deliver our main activities. Lastly and most importantly thank you to our members and community for your ongoing support.

Thanks also to Janice Haine for her role as the finance administrator. Paula Woods from Te Waitere has now taken on this role.

One of the exciting developments over the year has been the joining of the 3 Coast sub-catchments, Marokopa, South Kawhia, and North Kawhia. KCRC has contracted Robyn Williamson as a co-ordinator.

Robyn knows the area and people of the coast sub-catchments well and her role will mainly concentrate there. We are able to vary our MPI and 1BT contracts to allow us to include the Coast area in our activities. Tim Stokes, Chris Irons and Sarah Barron have joined the committee to represent these subcatchments.

In 2020/2021 We had 113 farming members and 8 associate members, in addition to this 30 new members have joined up from the coast catchments.

### **Our MPI Sustainable Land Use** project

12 Farm Planning workshops attended by over 100 people

37 other workshops/meetings attended by 484 people. These included Google Earth, Communications, Nutrient Budgeting, First Aid, Planting fielddays, Carbon on Farm, Know your GHG number.

These workshops and meetings were delivered between March and September.

8 community wellbeing projects have been funded so far ranging from First Aid courses to planting community areas.

Our 1BT project goal is to plant 200,000 plants by winter end 2023, to create work, and involve as many farmers as possible. To June this year we have paid out \$335K to 49 farmers who have already, or plan to, plant 85000 plants. Uptake has been a little slower than we would have liked, but steady.

KCRC relationship with WRC has been enhanced in the last year by having regular scheduled meetings with them. We have had WRC staff present at various workshops throughout the year when appropriate. This has all worked well. We were fortunate enough to attend the finals of the Ballance Farm Environment Awards as one of 3 catchment group finalists. Puniu River Care won our section. Congratulations to members Murray and Janet Easton and Russell and Mavis Proffitt who both won awards on the night.

KCRC have been involved with an AgResearch SLMACC project over the last year focusing on expert input into Farm Environment Plans. Thank you to Jenny Howie and Rock Fraei for volunteering their time to be involved with this. The project has now moved to the farm of Ken and Paula Woods at Te Waitere for the next 12 months.

Three properties are involved with an Our Land and Water (OLW) project in the Lower Mokau Catchment. This involves building 3 differing sediment dams and measuring effectiveness. A field-day will be held to share results. These should be of great interest to hill country farmers in our area.

The government has requested submissions on a variety of proposed regulations for on over the last 12 months. Not many have been met with much enthusiasm by the farming community. We are facing Knowing our GHG emissions number, Freshwater Farm Planning, Winter Grazing Rules, Ute Tax, Biodiversity and SNA's. PC1 has stalled whilst trying to digest and incorporate the governments rules which it must include. We have seen whole farms in our community sold for Carbon Farming, not something I can get enthusiastic about due to the impact it will have on our rural communities if the trend grows.

I find this a somewhat bewildering time to be farming. With product prices currently strong or improving for the other white gold it is a good time to be farming but there is uncertainty around how current regulation proposals will

play out. I am glad we have KCRC to support us through some of the challenges and opportunities ahead.

All the best for the coming season.

### ROADING UPGRADE INFORMATION

Downer is the road maintenance provider for Waka Kotahi New Zealand Transport Agency in Taranaki. As part of this year's work programme we'll be completing surface repairs on State Highway 3 between Urenui and 8-Mile Junction (at the SH4 turnoff).

The work is in preparation for resealing, which is scheduled to be completed in the following months and is part of a large 3–5-year programme of safety improvements across Taranaki State Highways.

Here is what you need to know:

- -Work is scheduled to commence on 13 September 2021, and will take approximately 3-4 weeks to complete (weather permitting).
- -Work crews will be on site between 3.00am-6.00pm each day. Traffic will be managed using Stop/Go, with delays being approximately 5-10 minutes per site
- -Our crews will be operating anywhere between 1-4 sites in the area at a given time.
- -If access to your property is limited at this time, and you need to travel, please speak with one of our onsite crew. We'll make every effort to get you through the site safely.
- -All operations will adhere to COVID-19 Alert Level restrictions set by NZ Government.






