

Congratulations to the team at Mokau that put together a programme of 'Summer Events,

2018/19' (#loveMOKAUsummer). I know the guided walk to Mohakatino Falls was well attended and thoroughly enjoyed.

As part of Councils District Plan Review we had a Te Kuiti Town Centre Retail Assessment compiled. It will provide a sound economic base to aid our decision making around retail and commercial service land demands into the future. Apart from quantifying the current extent of surplus retail space, it provided a very interesting financial snapshot. Of the total retail spend by Waitomo District residents, only 49% is spent within the district, with 51% spent outside the district (Otorohanga District 7%, Waipa District 9%, Hamilton City 14%, and no others greater than 5%) which is partially compensated by a 28% in flow spend by people living outside the district. With Waitomo District currently generating around \$60m per annum of retail sales, small changes in those spending percentages can have a big impact on our local economy. 
