# Recycle Waitomo

The Waitomo District Landfill provides for all your recycling and waste disposal requirements. The Landfill is located on William Street Te Kuiti and is open from Wednesday to Sunday, from 9am to 4pm.

The following waste types are collected for recycling at the Waitomo District Landfill:

### **Paper Products**

- **Newspapers**
- Flat white office paper
- Shredded white office paper
- Magazines and glossy leaflets
- Corrugated cardboard
- Egg cartons

### Metals

- Aluminium cans
- Scrap steel cans (washed)
- All steel scrap
- Whiteware appliances

### **Plastics**

Rinsed and squashed

- Milk bottles (no lids)
- PET bottles (i.e soft-drink and water bottles, no lids)
- Household plastics

Plastic types with a 1 and 2 symbol on the bottom can be recycled.

## **Glass Bottles and Jars**

Rinsed

- Clear
- Green
- Brown





The Re-Use Shop located at the Waitomo District Landfill will take anything that is re-usable that could be prevented from going to the landfill.

Items that are re-useable, need to be in a condition that would allow for someone else to want to purchase and use again. This can include a variety of goods such as books, shoes, clothes, furniture, gardening equipment, toys, bicycles, dinnerware and more.

Take your unwanted household items to the Re-use Shop and help to protect our natural environment.

# Greenwaste

Waitomo District Landfill accepts all clean greenwaste. This includes branches (up to 400mm in diameter), twigs, lawn clippings, leaves. Fibrous materials like flax, bamboo, toi toi, and cabbage tree leaves will not be accepted.

Greenwaste (garden waste) can be recycled by composting. It saves you money, feeds your garden and you're helping to protect your environment by reducing waste to landfill.

















# e-waste

The Transfer Station at the Waitomo District Landfill accepts e-waste for collection.

Electronic Waste (e-waste) is waste electrical equipment that has become obsolete, broken or unwanted. This includes computers, computer screens, fax machines, home whiteware, TVs and electrical cables, basically anything with a plug.

Dispose of your e-waste for recycling at the Transfer Station and help to reduce hazardous waste to Landfill.









# Waste transfer stations Waste Transfer Stations are provided at the rural locations of:

Piopio, Benneydale, Marokopa, Kinohaku and Awakino.

Recycling facilities are provided for the following waste types:

- Corrugated cardboard
- Newspaper
- Aluminium cans
- Plastic milk bottles (plastic types 1 and 2 symbol can be recycled).
- PET bottles (i.e soft-drink and water bottles, salad dressing and peanut butter containers, types 1 and 2).
- Glass bottles (clear, green or brown).





A FREE recycling programme for your plastic agrichemical, animal health and dairy hygiene containers!

Triple rinsed, up to 20 litre chemical containers (of participating brands) can be dropped off at the Waitomo District Landfill Transfer Station. Containers must be empty and triple rinsed (see process below) and leave the label on for identification.



# 1, 2, 3... Get Rinsing!



Partially fill container with clean water and replace the cap securely.



2. Shake container vigorously for at least 30 seconds, so that the rinse water reaches all inside surfaces.



Pour the agrichemical waste water into the dispensing tank and let it drain for 30 seconds, after flow reduces to drops.
