Council is required to review its Bylaws every 5 years as per the requirements of the Local Government Act 2002. At this time Council is reviewing the following Bylaws:

- Water Services Bylaw
- Public Amenities Bylaw

The Water Services Bylaw provides regulation to support the effective management, use and protection of Councils water supplies and Stormwater and wastewater systems.

The Public Amenities Bylaw controls a range of activities in public spaces to ensure that acceptable standards of convenience, safety and civic values are maintained for the well-being and enjoyment of citizens and visitors.
