Rates Rebate Scheme - Reminder

If you are a low income earner and are the legal rate payer for your property you may be eligible for a rates rebate of up to \$595.00.

The level of your rebate is dependant on your income, the total value of your rates assessment and the number of dependants, if any.

To check whether you are entitled to this or a lesser value rebate please contact our friendly Customer Services Team on 07 878 0800 or 0800 932 4357, visit our website www.waitomo.govt.nz or Waitomo District Council located on Queen Street Te Kuiti.

To apply you must have been living at the property on the 1st of July 2013, provide proof of your gross income to 31 March 2013, your Waikato Regional Rates, and your Waitomo District Council Rates.

The closing date for 2013/2014 applications is 5pm Monday 30 June 2014.

If you have successfully received a rebate in the last 12 months you will receive an application for the 2014/2015 rating year in your mailbox by the end of August.

NOTIFICATION OF LIFTING OF FIRE BAN

(Imposed Pursuant to section 22(2) of the Forest and Rural Fires Act 1977)

WAITOMO DISTRICT RURAL FIRE AREA

Notice is hereby given that pursuant to Section 22(2) of the Forest and Rural Fires Act (1977) the fire ban currently imposed by the Waitomo District Council over the rural fire area for which the Council is the Fire Authority is lifted from midnight Wednesday 30 April 2014.

Fires may now be lit in the open air in rural areas without permit. Restrictions may be re-imposed at a later date if weather conditions create a potentially dangerous fire situation.

All residents are requested to take care when lighting open fires. Before lighting fires in the open air, careful consideration must be given to weather conditions, adequacy of fire breaks, availability of water, and the patrolling of fires until completely out. Fires are not to be left burning after dark.
