

Highlights were many and included:-


- A day at The Octopus Hideaway in Leigh where all students and parents snorkelled in the Goat Island Marine Reserve.

- A sail on a replica sailing ship, the R Tucker Thompson, with all children climbing the rigging


and having a turn at steering.

## COUNCILLORS UPDATE; 2016 RESIDENT SURVEY

Each year we survey Waitomo District residents to gauge their satisfaction with the different services provided by the Council such as roads and footpaths, water supply and refuse and recycling. This year we are proposing an extra section on 'Liveability – Waitomo as a Place to Live'. The answers to this survey help guide the Council in its planning for future service levels, and direction of development.

The 2016 Resident Survey will be a paper survey distributed to each letter box in the District, but will also be available online at www.waitomo.govt.nz .The Survey will be distributed in late April/early May, and is required to be returned to Waitomo District Council by Friday 13 May 2016. Each completed survey returned to Council by that date will have a chance to win one of five \$200 Te Kuiti New World grocery vouchers. Please take the time to complete the

survey, preferably as soon as it arrives, as your answers, opinions and ideas are very important in helping us plan for the future of our District, but please - only one completed survey per household.

The 'thumbs down' in a recent Waitomo news regarding the 'nonopening' of the Piopio Transfer Station on Statutory Holiday Mondays came to my attention and I was rather disappointed the writer hadn't made contact with me for an explanation prior to going to print. The previously established arrangement was that the facility would be open from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm each Monday. The new arrangement is that the Piopio Transfer Station will not operate on any Monday that falls on a Statutory Holiday. That change when applied to say the 2016 calendar year would mean that the Piopio Transfer Station will not open on 8 Mondays out of the

We identified that the use of the service on a statutory holiday that fell

on a Monday (i.e. Anzac Day morning or Boxing Day morning) was low. In that situation, WDC cannot justify the extra labour costs to the ratepayer in operating on a Monday Statutory Holiday given that the facility is open on the Saturday and Sunday beforehand. This minor change is in line with the Council's aim of seeking out the best mix of arrangements for cost-effective service delivery.

Other than for Statutory Holiday Mondays, Piopio Transfer Station (normal) opening hours are: Monday and Wednesday 9am – 1pm, Saturday 8am – 12 noon and Sunday 1pm – 5pm.

The change was listed under WDC Notices in the Waitomo News (pg 21) Thursday 28 January 2016.

#### ARIA TWO DAY BIKE RIDE

The annual Aria two day bike ride was held at the Aria Domain on the 13th and 14th of February. The bike ride, which began as an Aria school fundraiser, has now grown so large that it has become an event that is run by many from the wider Aria community.

This year the opportunity to ride three 40km tracks over a number of properties in the area attracted 879 riders over two days, some coming from as far away as BOP and

Wellington. Many families support the two day ride too as it is a chance for newer riders to test themselves on the shorter rides as well as the kiddies track.

On Saturday evening we held the 'mud run', where keen riders try and get as far as they can into a huge mud pit with the winning rider collecting a small bounty for their efforts.

Nearly 300 people camped at the Aria Domain this year and our team of helpers fed nearly 300 people for dinner on Saturday night as well as around 100 hungry mouths for breakfast each day.

This year the profit for the event was \$27,000. Aria Primary received \$20,000, St Helen's Domain Board \$5,650 and the rest of the proceeds were split amongst King Country Honda, Piopio Lions Club, St Mary's
