

I have been working on a proposal for KCRC to get some funding from MPI to support our work helping farmers and sub-catchment groups doing great work to improve the environment and the wellbeing of our rural communities. 1Billion Trees for native trees if there is sufficient interest - let me know if you want more info.

A few of you have called about projects on farm - mostly fencing and planting waterways. We are waiting for details from Waikato Regional council around funding. The Hill Country Erosion fund (HCEF) which WRC administers will extend to cover the entire Mokau catchment as well as Awakino and Marokopa from September this year. This will be a great opportunity to get some on farm work underway throughout our catchment areas. Adrian Jepson (Adrian.Jepson@waikatoregion.govt .nz) is the contact for these projects. The purpose/focus of this joint WRC-MPI funded

programme is soil conservation and erosion risk/control in

hill country catchments. We understand it will include riparian planting for the 2019/20 financial year.

Waikato Regional Council elections are coming up - it would be great to have a couple of candidates from down this way - please encourage anyone you know who may be interested in a new challenge.

Memories of horses in a lifetime By Peter Holbrook

After a year back in England – mainly working on the new motorways fencing horse fair in July prior to the lambing with an Irish gang – I decided to return to New Zealand. I arrived back in Auckland in March 1964 and headed back to the King Country, working in the Mangapehi Sawmill to begin with, and then to a shepherding job on the Hobern property at Kopaki.

In December I began working as a shepherd general on the Dawson's property at Paemako. I was able to buy and sell my own horses and break-in horses from other farms. At this time I broke in three or four horses for Puketiti station which were trucked out to me and then ridden back into the homestead through Waitoru Station.

At lambing time, during the mid to late sixties, all the surrounding farms were mostly patrolled on horse back with a heading dog in attendance to catch ewes in trouble. The ewes were mainly Romney and prone to being cast with a higher percentage of difficult births. Moving into the 1970s, the easy care Perendales became more popular and the two-wheel motor bikes started to take over.

During the horse time, Piopio held a season. This was very popular with the horse-minded section of the community.

The sale began with a number of dependable hacks, demonstrated at a brisk walk with raincoats flapping. A fast-walking horse that would stand with the reins down and then carry a sheep was the most prized. Following these were several pens of unbroken horses which were looked over for their my experience most horses sooner or potential it was always satisfying to select a good one and make a good hack out of it to sell on later at a profit.

Unlike machinery, horses improve with good handling and the work they did was a bonus instead of fuel and depreciation of mechanical transport.

Although there was the inevitable decline in the use of horses for stockwork in the seventies I obtained work in the contract breaking of hacks on sheep stations mainly around Taumaranui, as well as my yearly visit to Puketiti station out from Piopio. I enjoyed this as once the horse has been successfully ridden by a shepherd and

passed by the manager it was over to them to keep them in work until reliable.



Breaking horses for individual owners was often unsatisfactory. Often they did not get enough work and developed a fault through lack of it, and the breaker was asked to return and sort them out again. I am not a great fan of some of the modern methods in vogue today, in later challenged the rider and that was the day the rider must win with determination – after this most horses accepted their lot and became useful mounts.

Most of the station's bred their own horses and kept a stallion and mares which had been worked when younger. There was also a series of two year old's and yearlings to be handled in preparation. I always cold shod the new horses before riding them, it had a quieting effect and prevented footsoreness when they needed enough work to confirm good habits.

I am a great believer in leg roping until the horse thoroughly understands it. They are much easier for a vet to handle and less likely to damage themselves if caught up in wire etc.

There is so much more I could write about. Horses are an endless subject with countless anecdotes to be recounted. I admire the younger generation, mostly female, who spend endless time and money with their sport horses.

However, these animals are basically pampered pets. My world which has largely gone is one I remember with respect. A station without horses is only a shadow now, merely a profit making organisation for the shareholders.
