Clay Harris stars at the Shears

ARIA SHEARER Clay Harris has starred on the New Zealand circuit this year with an impressive list of successes at the senior level.

"He's been winning everything," said his mother Karen Harris: which sums it up.

Just a few of his victories included wins at the Golden Shears, Taumarunui, Apiti & Districts, Gore, Balclutha... and the Wairoa Shears a month ago. Then, just last week there was the senior title at Raetihi in the Wools of New Zealand, and International Shearing Series at the Waimarino Shears.

In that competition, Kiwi shearers faced off against a team of their Welsh colleagues, and came out strongly.

And he's been doing just as well on home turf – on Waitangi Day, Clay won the senior final at the Aria Sports Day.

While the visiting Mongolian shearers wowed the crowd with their meticulous scissor technique – taking perhaps twenty minutes to remove the wool from a single sheep – Clay shore ten in ten minutes in his part of the competition.

Even the miserable weather at the Aria Sports Day didn't get in his way, or anyone else's.


The former Piopio College student has found his calling.

"He'll shear all day and then come home exhausted," she said.

"Even then he'll be on his phone watching videos of open class shearers who are better than him... men like Jack Fagan and Jimmy Samuels. I'll be cooking tea and Clay will be studying these top shearers and observing their technique," the newspaper reported.

All eyes will be on the young shearer at this week's New Zealand Shearing Championships in Te Kuiti... to see what he'll win next.





Learnings from the low cost "Forest Grade Natives" on farm pilots will be discussed and demonstrated at onfarm Fieldays in the next few months





Holly's story next page

Holly: yoga transformed my life

KIA ORA, I am Holz (Holly Alcock to most of you). I was born and raised in Mokauiti, attending Aria Primary then Piopio College. Fast forward to now, wife, mum of two, sports coach, counsellor, yoga teacher and more, living in Te Kuiti.

"You should come to yoga with me, my friend said". In my mind 100 thoughts were swimming, my heart was racing 1000 beats per minute and I felt like I was going to throw up.

I had been experiencing severe and debilitating anxiety, rendering me powerless and often housebound, so when my friend suggested leaving the house, trying something new, with a bunch of strangers I almost said "NO" She promised we could arrive together, practice next to each other and that it would be so beneficial for my anxiety and my mental health. The past few months had been hell and I thought nothing could be worse, so why not give it a go.

I wasn't a woo woo or spiritual person, nor was I a herb tea, drinking hippie (coz thats the types of people I thought did yoga), I made a lot of excuses, like I didn't have a mat or yoga "clothing". Nonetheless I drove to my first class, and met my friend outside, was greeted by some familiar faces inside, then yoga began.

To be fair I do not remember the first few classes at all! But I moved through the motions, managed to resist the urge to run out when the teacher offered us to quietly leave if we wished, before the final relaxation and meditation (funnily enough now my fave aspect of yoga).

I found myself returning each week, I noticed my anxiety present was less and less, my friend had had to stop coming to classes due to other commitments at that time, however I still made my mental health, my physical health and my spiritual health a priori-



ty. And I discovered maybe I was a little woo woo and spiritual after all.

I felt constantly pulled to my mat, that pull to calm the central nervous system and self regulate (I had no idea that's what I was doing at the time), supporting me and all aspects of my

I wanted to deepen my knowledge of all things yoga, I wanted to be able to delve into the how's, the why's and the what's of how this seemingly simple practice had transformed my life, my health and who I was as a person. I had zero intentions of actually becoming a yoga teacher at all!

However, in June last year I became a fully qualified 200-hour yoga teacher. Two days later, the teacher of my usual weekly class became unwell about 1 hour before class, and Ainslie was out of town and so it led me to my mat. Thank goodness for our beautiful Yoga community who have welcomed me and all that I am.

Here I am, some nearly 10 months later, my practice has further strengthened, and my teaching continues to improve with time and confidence.

It's always an honour to relief teach at "Ainslies class" as we both know how close Piopio and its people are to both of us, and knowing she trusts me to lead her classes is a special little confidence booster. Although, no pressure teaching Ainslie's Mum!

What a journey it has been so far and only really beginning. I am forever grateful for that opportunity almost 4 years ago to begin my yoga practice. My journey now sees me take the "yoga" of life off my mat and embrace the ethics and principles in my every-

I am looking forward to the next part of this journey.




