Awards event for youth

AN awards ceremony organised by youth for youth will take place in Te Kuiti next month.

Hosted by the Waitomo District Youth Council, the inaugural Waitomo District Youth Awards will be held at the Les Munro Centre on January 23.

Currently in the nominations stage, the event aims to celebrate and acknowledge outstanding successes by Waitomo teens during the past 12 months.

Nominations for six categories – sport, education, leadership, community, culture and arts and supreme – close on Friday for young people aged 13-18 who have lived in Waitomo for at least a year.

Funding of \$21,000 for the event was received in July from the Government's Youth Development Partnership Fund which was established to get people aged 12-24 involved in leading community projects.

Youth council spokesperson Sydney Karaitiana says the awards are also an opportunity to teach those involved what it takes to plan a major event from booking a venue to secur-

ing judges and budgeting as well as public speaking, time management and marketing.

Aside from learning how to develop and deliver a detailed management plan, Sydney says the main objective is to celebrate and showcase youth achievement

"There are a lot of youth achievements in this district that go unrecognised," she says.

"Outside of the annual school prizegivings and sports awards, there are many other things young people do that don't fit in to those events.

"So for me, this would be a success if it makes our youth feel deserving and valued for what they've achieved this year."

Other youth council members involved in planning the event say they've learned the value of leadership, teamwork and time management as well as appreciation for those who host other major events locally.

"It's a great learning curve for everyone involved and the skills gained from hosting an event like this will
