KERBSIDE COLLECTION DAY CHANGES

Waitomo District Changing Kerbside Collection Schedule

The Waitomo district is changing its kerbside collection schedule to improve service quality and processing efficiency.


Commencing from Monday, 1 July 2024, a revised timetable will be implemented. This will affect a substantial number of households across Te Kūiti, Piopio, Mōkau, Awakino, and Waitomo Village, with adjustments to the day of the week their recycling and blue refuse bags are collected.

Waitomo District Council General Manager Infrastructure Services, Shyamal Ram, says modifying our waste collection routes is essential for improving the service we provide to our community.

"These changes not only address the needs of our current customers but also ensure the efficiency and reliability of our kerbside service demands in the district.»

June Opie's personal struggles and triumphs with the disease led her to write the book "Over my dead body" bringing hope though her story to many affected with polio. Although June largely lived in the UK throughout her professional career, she never lost touch with her roots in Mōkau.

Celebrating her centennial birthday Kath and the team have created a new display depicting her life story, her struggles, and triumphs. They have even found some early video footage of June being interviewed by NZBC while doing research on her book. Opening early June this is a display well worth seeing.

MISS JUNE OPIE HURT IN MISHAP

Taranaki Daily News 18 January 1958

The well known Taranaki authoress, Miss June Opie, formerly of Mokau, suffered a fractured right femur and a fractured right arm in a collision on the northern side of the Mokau River bridge on Saturday. Other passengers in Miss Opie's car and the other car involved, suffered shock and abrasions.

The other car, driven by a Mrs Hopkins, United States, skidded in loose metal at the approach to the bridge forcing Miss Opie's car partly off the road. Miss Opie's passengers were her mother, Mrs K Opie, Mokau and aunt Mrs W Goodin from New Plymouth, both of whom received cuts and abrasions.

Both cars, especially Miss Opie's, which was the smaller of the two, were extensively damaged. Miss Opie's car, a small English model, was specially fitted with hand controls.

Her legs are still partly paralysed from an attack of poliomyelitis which completely crippled her on a voyage to England some years ago, and from which she is still slowly recovering. The illness and her recovery are the subject of her best seller 'Over My Dead Body'.



DISTRICT HEALTH NURSE

PHYSIOTHERAPY CLINIC AT MŌKAU

A reminder that Health NZ is funding a physiotherapy clinic in Mōkau once a month in 2024.

The physiotherapist is called Louise Robinson and she has been working as a physio in Taranaki for the last 8 years.

This clinic is designed for people with long term musculoskeletal conditions, for example arthritis or persistent back pain.

This physio clinic is accessible via referral from any healthcare provider, including GPs, specialists, and nurses. Appointments are scheduled through Louise and the physiotherapy department at the hospital – Taranaki Te Whatu Ora/Health NZ Base Hospital. To arrange a referral for this service, you can reach out to the Mōkau nurse.

BOWEL CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

June is bowel cancer awareness month. New Zealand has one of the highest incidences of bowel cancer in the world. Bowel cancer is the second highest cause of cancer deaths in New Zealand, second only to lung cancer. Bowel cancer is curable in more than 90% of cases if caught early.

Being aware of the symptoms is the first step you can take to prevent bowel cancer. Symptoms may come and go, so don't delay - no matter what age you are, see your GP if you experience any of the following:

• Bleeding from the bottom (rectal bleeding)

- Persistent or intermittent change in bowel habits
- · Anaemia, feeling weak, or breathless
- Persistent or periodic severe abdominal pain
- A lump or mass in the abdomen
- Tiredness and loss of weight for no obviousreason

BEYOND THE AWA IN CLIFTON

Council received about 3500 submissions to the long term plan, which is an extraordinary response and much of it supporting the key elements of plan. There was over 6 days of oral submissions for and against particular elements some of which have made it to mainstream media. So much to say that this has been consuming a lot of council time and energy and shows how important the community engagement is. The plan sets the ambitions over the next 10 years and the fall out of this is the budgets which set the rates for the next 3 years. Not long now and we will be able to focus on the doing.

It is important that the Clifton Community Board enables each community in the area the opportunity to easily engage with their elected members. To aide this we are holding board meeting around the district with the aim to get to each at least annually. The next meeting is on 4th July and will be held in the Uruti hall. This will be advertised locally and we want locals to come and raise any concerns they have.

The other day I witnessed and incident at the SH3-Pilot Rd intersection where a tourist almost got rear-ended by a fully laden truck. This is a hazardous intersection even for those of us who know how to navigate it, and if the visibility is not improved, my fear is that we will scrape someone up off the road here. This has been raised with NZTA many times before and with the help on relationships from within council I am beating the drum again.

ST PETERS BY THE SEA

God is Love

A little while back I read this.

Twice in 1 John 4:7-21 we are told, "God is Love". In making this profoundly important statement John is not simply telling us that God is loving - as if love is simply one of the many attributes God processes alongside others. Much more than this, John wants us to understand that at the very heart and centre of Gods nature and being – the fundamental essence that constitutes the core of Gods very God-ness – is love. This being so, God does not possess some other inner motivator that sits at a deeper, more elemental place within his being that might, on occasions, displace his love. What this means is that Gods love has no reason beyond itself and therefore God does not use love as an instrumental technique to achieve some other purpose that isn't love. God's love is therefore genuine and so God respects the freedom and the integrity of those who are the relational objects and subjects of his love. Consequently, God never manipulates or coerce those he loves into any way of being they do not freely choose. This is why God gives all his relationships time and space to develop and flourish. God, in both creating us and the world, intends and enables a history of encounter to take place that allows all the different dimensions of loving relationality to be experienced and to grow. Gods love therefore creates room for development and change, joy and sorrow, alienation and reconciliation, sin and grace, judgement and salvation".

The thing about love is that our interpretation of it is often tainted with our childhood relationship experiences and thereby transposed in our view of God. For example, if we had a loving but austere, strict parent then our view of God is reflected in such a way of Him being austere, strict, and judgemental. So how can we objectively show who God is?

The most apt description of love is the well-known text of St Paul to the Corinthian church. 1 Cor 13; Love is patient, love is kind...etc. So, as God is love, let us personify the word "love" in this text with "God" to give a paraphrased description of who God is. 1 Corinthinians 13:4-7

God is patient, God is kind. He does not envy, he does not boast, he is not proud. God does not dishonour others, he is not self-seeking, he is not easily angered, he keeps no record of wrongs. God does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. God always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres.

Love always seeks meaningful relationship, and God is no different


