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# 1. Introduction

1. This Decision Report relates to all the submissions received by the Waitomo District Council (Council) on Chapter **25 Sites and Areas of Significance to Māori**, SCHED2 – Significant Archaeological Sites, SCHED3 – Sites and areas of **significance to Māori**, **SCHED 4 - Sites and Areas of Significance to Māori – wāhi tapu sites** and SCHED 5 - Sites and Areas of **Significance to Māori – Cultural Alert Layer**. This also includes related provisions within the Proposed Waitomo District Plan (PDP) such as Definitions (Chapter 9).
2. The Chapter and associated Schedules seek to recognise and provide for the **relationship Māori and their culture and traditions have with their ancestral lands, water, sites, wāhi tapu, and other taonga, which is a matter of national importance** under section 6(e) of the RMA. A key method for achieving this outcome is through the identification of sites that are of significance to mana whenua. These scheduled sites provide a tangible connection to ancestors, whenua (land) and significant historical events. This plan uses a tiered system to protect the cultural heritage values of identified sites.

## 2. Hearing arrangements

3. The hearing was held in person and online on 27 and 28 November 2024 in **Council's offices at 15 Queen Street, Te Kuiti. All of the relevant information pertaining to this hearing (i.e., Section 42A Reports, legal submissions and evidence) is contained on Council's website.**

5. The Panel did not hear any evidence from submitters at the hearing in relation to the Chapter and associated Schedules held on 27 and 28 November 2024.

### 3. Submitter evidence

6. Mr Ben Pick tabled evidence on behalf of Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga (HNZPT) in relation to two matters:

- Amendment to the mapped extent of SSM099 – **Kākāmorīa** to match the extent as provided in the heritage listing, and to list SSM099 in Schedule 4 – Wahi Tapu as opposed to Schedule 3.
- Amendments to the mapped extents of sites listed in Schedule 4 – Wahi Tapu.

#### Kākāmorīa

7. In his evidence, Mr Pick, requested that the extent and listing reference (i.e. legal descriptions etc) of **Kākāmorīa** as provided for in the Heritage New Zealand inventory (**wāhi tapu**) be amended in the PDP to be the same, as all mana whenua, HNZPT and the landowner agree with the extent, and that the site is listed in Schedule 4 of the PDP as a wahi tapu site.

#### Schedule 4 – Wahi Tapu

8. In his evidence, Mr Pick sought that the extents of the sites outlined below and identified in SCHED4 are amended to match the extents of the HNZPT listings to ensure that these sites are subject to the protective rule framework:
- Pehitawa-HNZPT Listing #7332
  - Uekaha-HNZPT Listing #6713
  - Pa-HNZPT Listing #6113
  - Ruakuri-HNZPT Listing #6721
  - Te Anaureure-HNZPT Listing #6722
  - Ngakuraho-HNZPT listing #9788
  - Te Pua o Te Ata-HNZPT Listing #7606
  - Pukeroa-HNZPT Listing #9822;
  - **Proposed Listing; Kākāmorīa, Hangatiki (proposed List no. # 9859)**
9. HNZPT considers that listings or scheduling with Sites and Areas of Significance **to Māori (SASM)** are often not discreet isolated places but a collection of places with spaces between the places capturing the ancestral footprint. All of these sites / places have been listed by HNZPT as worthy of protection having been **nominated by Mana Whenua and approved by the Māori Heritage Council**. HNZPT considers that where there are discrepancies its extents should be considered given the thorough research and process into extents that has been undertaken by HNZPT.
10. No other submitters tabled or presented evidence on this Chapter to the hearing panel.

## 4. Panel decision

11. Having considered the submissions and evidence presented, the Panel acknowledges **the general support for the PDP's amended provisions.**
12. The Panel agrees with the aim of the Chapter and associated Schedules, which **seek to recognise and provide for the relationship Māori and their culture and traditions have with their ancestral lands, water, sites, wāhi tapu, and other taonga**, which is a matter of national importance under section 6(e) of the RMA. The Panel found that:
  - It is appropriate for the Plan to enable, within limits, identified activities including maintenance and restoration of scheduled sites, grazing, cultivation, and minor land disturbance for specified activities on sites identified in SCHED3, SCHED4 and SCHED5.
  - That the Plan ensure the relationship of mana whenua with their **ancestral lands, water, sites, wāhi tapu and other taonga is protected** and provided for within **sites and areas of significance to Māori, wāhi tapu** sites and sites identified as part of the cultural alert layer.
  - This plan also provides flexibility for mana whenua, where a **Concept Management Plan has been approved by the Māori Land Court, and** where there are existing buildings located within the scheduled site. Outside of these opportunities, the provisions of this chapter only consider built development to be appropriate in **exceptional circumstances and where the site's values, in collaboration with mana whenua, are permanently protected.**
  - The Plan seeks to ensure that the archaeological authority process, which is administered by HNZPT, is not duplicated through provisions in this Plan.

### Kākāmorua

13. The Panel notes that the Section 42A Report writer has agreed with the request from Mr Pick (in his evidence) and Ms Machra (in her submission) to align the mapped extent of SSM099 – **Kākāmorua** to the heritage listing (9859), and to list SSM099 in Schedule 4 – Wahi Tapu. The Panel accepts the recommendation in the Section 42A Addendum on this basis, as all parties have agreed to the amendment sought.
14. Schedule 4 – Wahi Tapu
15. The Panel notes that the evidence of Mr Pick does not respond to the significant analysis in the Section 42A Report and Section 42A addendum with respect to the reasoning for the extent of each of the sites that has been proposed in the PDP and why they differ from the HNZPT listing. The Panel also notes the considerable engagement and consultation that has been undertaken by the Council with mana whenua in respect of these sites, and the opportunities that have been afforded to HNZPT by the Council to engage in a constructive site by site discussion. Therefore, due to the absence of any evidence to the contrary, the extents of the sites as identified in the notified Plan are accepted. The Panel does not consider there is any compelling evidence to amend the approach as set out in the Section 42A Report and Section 42A Addendum.

16. Otherwise, unless stated in the Panel decision above, the Panel has elected to adopt the recommendations in the Section 42A Report and the Section 42A Addendum Report on this chapter.

## 5. Conclusion

17. The Panel accepts the recommendations in the section 42A reports and where noted above, the evidence filed by the submitters. The reasons for this are those set out in the section 42A reports, the evidence, and provided in this Decision; collectively forming the section 32AA assessment informing this Decision.
18. Overall, the Panel is satisfied that the provisions of the Chapter, as amended will provide a suitable framework for **recognise and provide for the relationship Māori and their culture and traditions have with their ancestral lands, water, sites, wāhi tapu, and other taonga**, which is a matter of national importance under section 6(e) of the RMA across the Waitomo District.
19. The Panel accepts, accepts in part, or rejects the submissions as set out in the section 42A reports.

# Sites and Areas of Significance to Māori

## | Ngā Wahi Tapu ki te Māori

### Overview

Under the RMA, it is a matter of national importance to recognise and provide for the relationship Māori and their culture and traditions have with their ancestral lands, water, sites, **wāhi tapu**, and other taonga. A key method for achieving this outcome is through the identification of sites that are of significance to mana whenua. These scheduled sites provide a tangible connection to ancestors, whenua (land) and significant historical events. This plan uses a tiered system to protect the cultural heritage values of identified sites.

Sites and areas of **significance to Māori** listed in [SCHED3](#) and the **wāhi tapu** sites listed in [SCHED4](#) are referred to in this chapter as 'scheduled sites'. The provisions of this plan treat these scheduled sites in exactly the same manner. They are only differentiated in the schedules because of the difference in the way they have been identified.



Cultural Alert Layer sites listed in [SCHED5](#) are treated differently to the scheduled sites. They do not directly trigger the requirement for a resource consent. This is explained in more detail in the text below.

### Sites and Areas of Significance to Māori

**Sites and areas of significance to Māori** are places and features that are of historical, cultural and/or spiritual significance to Māori. These scheduled sites and areas carry deep levels of meaning and association for mana whenua. In developing this plan, Waitomo District Council has engaged with mana whenua who have identified significant sites and their boundaries. The list of sites is contained in [SCHED3](#) – Sites and Areas of Significance to Māori. Sites in [SCHED3](#) have been grouped into 12 categories: takotoranga, pakanga, mahinga kai, taunga waka, kaitiaki, mahinga tawhito, nohoanga, ana, parahanga, pouwhenua, wai, and wāhi tupuna. An explanation of the categories is contained in the schedule. Additional information about these scheduled sites is held by mana whenua and can be made available through consultation. The list of sites in the schedule is not exclusive. It is anticipated more sites will be added to the plan over time.

In order to have increased certainty, people undertaking developments and activities on **sites and areas of significance to Māori** are encouraged to consult with mana whenua early in the development process. The Maniapoto Environmental Management Plan and the Waikato Tainui Environmental Management Plan provide a step by step process on how to engage with mana whenua, and applicants are encouraged to follow this process.

Identification of the **sites and areas of significance to Māori** enables developers and landowners to plan and undertake development activities in a way that minimises or avoids disturbance to these places or features. As the identification of sites is ongoing, developers and landowners are encouraged to engage early with mana whenua to see whether there are further sites of significance that may need consideration.

For some scheduled sites, the values maybe intangible and associated with the history and narratives of mana whenua. On other sites the original visible features may have been lost or damaged through exposure to weather, earthworks or coverage of a site by buildings or impermeable surfaces. In this case, subsurface features may still remain and management of the location and volume of earthworks is important. Where a scheduled **site's features have been destroyed or damaged, recognition of the site's existence may** still be desirable through careful location of new buildings, signs, planting or through other appropriate methods. Even where such sites no longer exist physically, their memory and association remain important.

Mana whenua are the kaitiaki or spiritual guardian of these sites and areas which are located on both **Māori** land and on general title land. In some cases, these scheduled sites are land-locked and require landowner permission to access. Reconnection to these sites is encouraged through incentive provisions to provide permanent access in the subdivision chapter.

This chapter contains provisions that seek to protect the sites and areas of significance to **Māori and** to manage inappropriate activities. This plan provides for some activities such as grazing of livestock and maintenance of fence lines and existing farm tracks where there will be only minor effects. This plan also provides flexibility for mana whenua, where a Concept Management Plan has been approved by the **Māori** Land Court, and where there are existing buildings located within the scheduled site. Outside of these opportunities, the provisions of this chapter only consider built development to be appropriate in exceptional circumstances and where the site's values, in collaboration with mana whenua, are permanently protected.

### **Wāhi tapu Sites**

Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga (HNZPT) have identified seven sites within Waitomo district that are listed as **wāhi tapu** sites under the Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga Act 2014. Some of these scheduled sites are also an archaeological site. This plan lists these seven sites in [SCHED4 – Wāhi tapu Sites](#), and treats these sites in exactly the same manner as **the sites and areas of significance to Māori listed in [SCHED3](#)**.

### **Cultural Alert Layer**

**Sites and areas of significance to Māori** - Cultural Alert Layer [SCHED5](#) identifies sites which are of particular importance to mana whenua. Some sites are the location of battles, some are places of long term occupation, some are associated with important tribal histories and narratives and some are urupa. These sites may contain tangible or intangible features. Many of the sites include productive farm land, residential properties or are on reserves. On these sites, mana whenua have signalled the need to balance the protection of lawfully established activities with the requirement to avoid inappropriate development.

In order to achieve this balance, sites subject to the cultural alert layer do not directly trigger the requirement for a resource consent. However, if resource consent is required for another matter within this alert layer, an assessment of the impact of the activity on

the cultural heritage values of the site is required. An example might be a resident wishing to build a building which triggers the need for a resource consent or a rural landowner deciding to excavate a new farm quarry. As part of this resource consent application, a cultural impact assessment on the values of the site is required. Over the lifetime of this plan, Waitomo District Council plans to undertake cultural impact assessments for some sites. These assessments may be used by applicants. Objective SASM-O3, policy SASM-P12 and rule SASM-R24 are the only provisions in this chapter that apply to sites in the cultural alert layer.

## Archaeology

An archaeological site is any place (including buildings, structures or shipwrecks) that was associated with pre-1900 human activity, where there is evidence relating to the history of New Zealand that can be investigated using archaeological methods. Archaeological sites are managed by HNZPT under the Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga Act 2014. There are large numbers of archaeological sites recorded in the district. The Waitomo District Council website provides a map showing archaeological sites in the district which have been identified by the New Zealand Archaeological Association (NZAA) Site Recording Scheme.

Under the Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga Act 2014, it is unlawful to destroy, damage or modify an archaeological site without obtaining an archaeological authority from HNZPT before work is started.

If a previously unknown archaeological site is discovered (for example, when you are conducting earthworks) work must stop. The process to be followed is outlined in the advice notes to this chapter.

## Objectives

- SASM-O1. Sites and areas of significance to **Māori** and **wāhi tapu** sites are recognised, scheduled and protected from inappropriate activities.
- SASM-O2. Recognise and provide for the ongoing relationship mana whenua have with **sites and areas of significance to Māori and wāhi tapu** sites.
- SASM-O3. Ensure the relationship of mana whenua with their ancestral lands, water, **sites, wāhi tapu and other taonga is** protected and provided for within **sites and areas of significance to Māori, wāhi tapu** sites and sites identified as part of the cultural alert layer.
- SASM-O4. Continue to consult and collaborate with mana whenua to identify and schedule new sites and areas of **significance to Māori**.

- SASM-P3. Signs are only anticipated where they are official, interpretive or temporary signs and the design of the sign does not compromise the values associated with the site and/or its scheduled feature.

  3. Evaluating the extent to which the development achieves positive economic, social and cultural benefits for mana whenua now and into the future.
- SASM-P6. Enable mana whenua to sustainably develop and use sites and areas of significance to **Māori** and **wāhi tapu** sites in accordance with their cultural preferences and aspirations by allowing marae complex and papakāinga housing developments.
- SASM-P7. Earthworks must be managed to avoid adverse effects on the values of scheduled sites.
- SASM-P8. Except as provided for in SASM-P6, where there are no existing buildings located within a scheduled site, only allow built development where it can be demonstrated the site's values are permanently protected, having regard to:
1. Outcomes articulated through consultation with mana whenua through an assessment of environmental effects, cultural impact assessment, or iwi planning documents; and
  2. How **protection of the scheduled site's values including provision for tikanga Māori, kaitiakitanga, and mātauranga Māori** have been provided for; and
  3. Any practical mechanisms proposed to maintain or enhance the ability of mana whenua to access and use the site for karakia, monitoring, Māori cultural and customary uses and ahi kā roa; and
  4. Whether there are alternative methods, locations, or designs that would avoid or reduce the effects on the values of the scheduled site; and

5. Whether there is the potential to enhance the values of the scheduled site and the relationship mana whenua have with the site, commensurate with the scale and nature of the proposal.

SASM-P9. Waitomo District Council will work with landowners to manage, maintain and preserve scheduled sites by:

1. Increasing community awareness, understanding and appreciation of the presence of, and importance of, scheduled sites; and
2. Encouraging engagement between landowners, mana whenua and/or marae to develop positive working relationships in respect of the ongoing management and protection of scheduled sites; and
3. In consultation and collaboration with mana whenua, promoting the use of **mātauranga Māori, tikanga Māori** and kaitiakitanga to manage, maintain and preserve scheduled sites; and
4. Where possible, providing assistance to landowners to preserve, maintain and enhance scheduled sites.

SASM-P10. Promote the provision or development of access for mana whenua to scheduled sites, through mechanisms such as:

1. Formal arrangements, including co-management, joint management or relationship agreements, easements and land covenants, or private access agreements; and
2. The use of benefit lots to encourage the provision of access to landlocked land parcels; and
3. Informal arrangements or understandings between landowners and mana whenua and/or marae.

SASM-P11. Investigate opportunities for **Māori** and by **Māori**, which facilitate improved management of scheduled sites, including the transfer of powers to mana whenua to manage cultural heritage resources.

SASM-P12. In the event a resource consent is triggered within the cultural alert layer, ensure that any proposed activity is appropriately assessed, and any resulting development is managed in a way that retains and protects the cultural heritage values of the site, including monitoring cumulative effects to ensure the appropriate regulatory approach is being utilised.

- *HNZPT Archaeologist must be notified and application made for the appropriate authority if required;*
- *Notify the appropriate iwi groups or kaitiaki representative of the discovery and ensure site access to enable appropriate cultural procedures and tikanga to be undertaken, as long as all statutory requirements under legislation are met (New Zealand Pouhere Taonga Act 2014);*
- *If human remains (koiwi) are uncovered then the HNZPT Archaeologist, NZ Police and the appropriate iwi groups or kaitiaki representative must be notified. Remains are not to be moved until such time as iwi, NZ Police and HNZPT have responded;*
- *Works affecting the archaeological site and any human remains (koiwi) must not resume until appropriate authority and protocols are completed.*

*If the protocol is not adhered to then HNZPT can take out prosecution proceedings under the New Zealand Pouhere Taonga Act 2014.*

## SCHED3 – Sites and areas of significance to Māori | Ngā Wahi Tapu ki te Māori

*Note: For some **sites and areas of significance to Māori**, the scheduled area does not match the legal parcel boundaries. Please see the planning maps to determine the area of a site that the listing applies to.*

### Site Categories and Descriptions

1. Ana (Cave): This is an ancestral site. Values and significance - valued for natural materials and shelter, this site is associated with the spiritual and sacred ancestral relationships of the local tribal custodians (people).
2. Kaitiaki (guardian): This site is the locale of a kaitiaki (guardian). Values and significance - there is a high probability of encounter with sensitive tangible and/or intangible values significant to the local tribal custodians (people).
3. Mahinga kai (Cultivation): This site is an important food and resource gathering place and/or this site likely contains the remnants **of communal gardens growing hue (gourd plant), uwhi (yam), taro (ground shield leaf), kūmara (sweet potato) and tī pore (cabbage tree)**. Values and significance - areas of cultivation and resource gathering which were highly prized and valued by ancestors. This area represents the physical manifestation of the relationship with Rongo (personification of cultivation) and is particularly significant to the local tribal custodians (people).
4. Mahinga tawhito (Ancient vestiges): This site has been identified and demarked by tribal experts. Values and significance - there is a high probability of encounter with ancestral vestiges both tangible and intangible that are significant to the local tribal custodians (people).
5. Nohanga (Village): This site is a village settlement associated to the local tribal custodians. Values and significance - this site was valued for its proximity to significant resources. Habitation was either seasonal or permanent and it is of significance to generations of the local tribal custodians (people).
6. Pakanga (Battle Site): This is a battle site has been identified and demarked by tribal experts. Values and significance - there is a high probability of encounter with sensitive tangible and/or intangible values significant to the local tribal custodians (people).

7. Parahanga (Midden/ disposal area): this site is proximal to a key food and resource gathering place and additionally related to local settlements and Pā. Values and significance – in addition to significant archaeological values, the site is particularly significant to, and under the guardianship of the local tribal custodians (people).
8. Pouwhenua (Landmark): this site is wāhi taonga and associated with significant tribal history and narratives. Values and significance – this landmark is associated with the deeds of the ancestors of the local tribal custodians. As a landmark it is valued for the significance associated with korero and whakapaunga kaha of the local tribal custodians (people).
9. Takotoranga (Burial Site): This site is associated with ancestral burial practices. Values and significance - this is an ancient burial site and is associated with tapu or sacred burial practices. This site is particularly significant to, and under the guardianship of the local tribal custodians (people).
10. Taunga Waka (A landing site for waka/ canoe): This site has been identified and demarked by tribal experts. Values and significance - A landing site for waka (canoe), this area represents the relationship with the inland waterways and the ocean space, and are particularly significant to the local tribal custodians (people).
11. Wai (Water): This site is a key food gathering area and/or a sacred or tapu site under the guardianship of the local tribal custodians (people). Values and significance - the site is related to tribal narratives, sacred rights and representations and valued natural resources associated with the local tribal custodians (people).
12. **Wāhi tupuna (Ancestral location):** This term symbolises life and the oral narratives of the local tribal guardians (people). As a landmark it is valued for its holistic association with the local tribal custodians as a collective, through the generations.

### Site Categories and Descriptions

1. Ana (Cave): This is an ancestral site. Values and significance - valued for natural materials and shelter, this site is associated with the spiritual and sacred ancestral relationships of the local tribal custodians (people).
2. Kaitiaki (guardian): This site is the locale of a kaitiaki (guardian). Values and significance - there is a high probability of encounter with sensitive tangible and/or intangible values significant to the local tribal custodians (people).
3. Mahinga kai (Cultivation): This site is an important food and resource gathering place and/or this site likely contains the remnants of communal gardens growing hue (gourd plant), uwhi (yam), taro (ground shield leaf), kūmara (sweet potato) and tī pore (cabbage tree). Values and significance - areas of cultivation and resource gathering which were highly prized and valued by ancestors. This area represents the physical manifestation of the relationship with Rongo (personification of cultivation) and is particularly significant to the local tribal custodians (people).
4. Mahinga tawhito (Ancient vestiges): This site has been identified and demarked by tribal experts. Values and significance - there is a high probability of encounter with ancestral vestiges both tangible and intangible that are significant to the local tribal custodians (people).
5. Nohanga (Village): This site is a village settlement associated to the local tribal custodians. Values and significance - this site was valued for its proximity to significant resources. Habitation was either seasonal or permanent and it is of significance to generations of the local tribal custodians (people).

6. Pakanga (Battle Site): This is a battle site has been identified and demarked by tribal experts. Values and significance - there is a high probability of encounter with sensitive tangible and/or intangible values significant to the local tribal custodians (people).
7. Parahanga (Midden/ disposal area): this site is proximal to a key food and resource gathering place and additionally related to local settlements and Pā. Values and significance – in addition to significant archaeological values, the site is particularly significant to, and under the guardianship of the local tribal custodians (people).
8. Pouwhenua (Landmark): this site is wāhi taonga and associated with significant tribal history and narratives. Values and significance – this landmark is associated with the deeds of the ancestors of the local tribal custodians. As a landmark it is valued for the significance associated with korero and whakapaunga kaha of the local tribal custodians (people).
9. Takotoranga (Burial Site): This site is associated with ancestral burial practices. Values and significance - this is an ancient burial site and is associated with tapu or sacred burial practices. This site is particularly significant to, and under the guardianship of the local tribal custodians (people).
10. Taunga Waka (A landing site for waka/ canoe): This site has been identified and demarked by tribal experts. Values and significance - A landing site for waka (canoe), this area represents the relationship with the inland waterways and the ocean space, and are particularly significant to the local tribal custodians (people).
11. Wai (Water): This site is a key food gathering area and/or a sacred or tapu site under the guardianship of the local tribal custodians (people). Values and significance - the site is related to tribal narratives, sacred rights and representations and valued natural resources associated with the local tribal custodians (people).
12. **Wāhi tupuna (Ancestral location):** This term symbolises life and the oral narratives of the local tribal guardians (people). As a landmark it is valued for its holistic association with the local tribal custodians as a collective, through the generations.

## 8. Appendix 3 – Section 32AA Evaluation

20. A Section 32AA Evaluation is only required for any changes that are proposed to the provisions of this plan since the original Section 32 Evaluation report for the proposal was completed. The Section 32AA Evaluation must be undertaken at a level of detail that corresponds to the scale and significance of the changes.

### Amendments

### Objectives

SASM-OX      Work with landowners to support the management, maintenance, preservation and access to scheduled sites.

#### Effectiveness and efficiency

21. It was noted that there is not an objective which directly provides for the relationship of landowners with the SASM and supports the policy framework. Policy SASM-P9 sets out how the Council will work with landowners to manage scheduled sites and SASM-P10 encourages formal and informal arrangements to promote access to sites. It is considered that additional Objective is the most efficient and effective way to provide for the policies.

#### Costs and benefits

22. On balance, there will be no change in cost, as it is necessary to provide an additional objective given the policy framework. It is considered that there will be a benefit to landowners and mana whenua through the addition of the Objective, as it encourages the parties to work together to support the management, maintenance, preservation and access to scheduled sites.

#### Risk of acting or not acting

23. It is considered that there is sufficient information to justify the changes above and there is a need to provide for consistency.

#### Decision about most appropriate option

24. The recommended amendments are the most appropriate way to achieve consistency across the Plan and gives effect to higher order policy documents.

### Policies

SASM-P9. Waitomo District Council will work with landowners to manage, maintain and preserve scheduled sites by:

1. Increasing community awareness, understanding and appreciation of the presence of, and importance of, scheduled sites; and
2. Encouraging engagement between landowners, ~~to engage with~~ mana whenua and/or marae ~~to and~~ develop positive working relationships in respect of the ongoing management and protection of scheduled sites; and

3. In consultation and collaboration with mana whenua, promoting **the use of mātauranga Māori, tikanga Māori and kaitiakitanga** to manage, maintain and preserve scheduled sites; and
4. Where possible, providing assistance to landowners to preserve, maintain and enhance scheduled sites.

25. Section 32AA: It is considered that this amendment is not a material change to the policy, as it is essentially adding additional wording to clarify its application and is not changing the effect. It is also consistent with the new Objective as set out above. Therefore, it is considered that a Section 32AA evaluation is not required.

SASM-P12. In the event a resource consent is triggered within the cultural alert layer, ensure that any proposed activity is appropriately assessed, and any resulting development is managed in a way that retains and protects the cultural heritage values of the site, including monitoring cumulative effects to ensure the appropriate regulatory approach is being utilised.

#### Effectiveness and efficiency

26. The amendment proposed to this Policy is necessary as this Chapter and associated Schedules are a new approach to the management of SASMs in the district. It will be beneficial to consider the cumulative effects on sites identified within the cultural alert area over time to ensure the appropriate regulatory approach is being utilised. Therefore, it is considered that this amendment is the most efficient and effective means of ensuring that cumulative effects are monitored and the correct regulatory approach utilised.

#### Costs and benefits

27. On balance, it is considered that there could ultimately be an increase in monitoring costs. However, this is outweighed by the benefit of ensuring that the appropriate regulatory approach is being utilised.

#### Risk of acting or not acting

28. It is considered that there is sufficient information to justify the changes above and there is a need to provide for consistency.

#### Decision about most appropriate option

29. The recommended amendments are the most appropriate way to achieve consistency across the Plan.

## Effectiveness and efficiency

30. The matter of discretion in SASM-R4(e), SASM-R5(e) and SASM-R8(e) applies to any practical mechanisms to maintain or enhance the ability of mana whenua to **access and use the site for Karakia, monitoring, customary uses and ahi kā roa**. On balance, it is considered that this amendment is appropriate as the matter of discretion does not directly relate to the effects of earthworks. The amendment does not remove any requirement to consult with mana whenua which is provided for through SASM-R4(b), SASM-R5(b) and SASM-R8(b).

## Costs and benefits

31. On balance, there will be no change in cost, as the amendment is simply to ensure consistency of approach used across provisions and as notified the provision was essentially a duplication of the process in the matter of discretion SASM-R4(b), SASM-R5(b) and SASM-R8(b). This will provide a benefit to plan users as it ensures consistency.

35. Section 32AA: This amendment clarifies the aspects of plantation forestry subject to the rule. It is a minor change to better identify the parameters of the rule. A Section 32AA evaluation is not required.

### Effectiveness and efficiency

36. It is considered that as the boundaries have been agreed between mana whenua, the landowner and HNZPT that Schedule 4 and the planning maps should be updated to match the extent of HNZPT listing 9859. This is the most efficient and effective means of achieving the relief sought by all parties.

## Costs and benefits

37. On balance, the change should reduce costs as there will no longer be any inconsistencies of approach between HNZPT and WDC in administering the regulatory functions in relation to this site.

## Risk of acting or not acting

38. It is considered that there is sufficient information to justify the changes above and there is a need to provide for consistency.

## Decision about most appropriate option

39. The recommended amendments are the most appropriate way to achieve consistency across the Plan.

## Schedule 3 amendments

40. Mana whenua requested an amendment to SSM018-A (map below) and Schedule 3 to change the name from **Te Paerata Papakāinga** to **Kautu**.
