I agree with the speed limit reduction on this stretch of Oparure Road. I consistently see (and hear) cars and trucks race past the kura, marae and our property going well over the "temporary" 50km speed limit signs. Walking to the marae, the kura & to neighbors & whānau around the village is not at all safe, especially for our tamariki and older people. Even driving out at the marae, kura and even our driveway is unsafe as ~~cars~~ vehicles go past so quickly, don't slow down at corners (especially near the kura & Boddies Rd) and when going at such speeds it can be hard to determine when it's safe to pull out of our driveways. Bottom line, 50km speed limit helps keep our community safe.
