

WHAT'S HAPPENING AT THE MUSEUM

Don't know if you had noticed, or maybe its just me, but there seems to be more campervans and caravans on the road. Even though the museum is closed Tues and Wed over the winter the visitor numbers was an all-time record for July. Its great to see Kiwi's take the opportunity to see their own backyard.

Jolly COVID has again given the country a bit of a swipe and I suspect is going to plague us for a bit longer yet. However, at level 2 the museum is able to remain open to the public. Extra precautions have been taken by the volunteers to ensure we are operating within the MoH guidelines keeping ourselves and the public safe.

In late July the museum hosted a class from Francis Douglas Boys High as part of a research project they were doing on coastal erosion in the area. The place was buzzing with 35 teenage boys as they had a good look through the displays. From the archives the museum presented maps and photos to show how much land has been lost to the sea over the past 5 decades. Particular thanks goes out to Phil Gudopp who enhanced the boys experience, taking them out on the farm to see the effects first hand. The teachers were impressed with the resources that were available and indicated a similar event will be planned for next years intake. A museum is more than just a collection of stuff and stories of a bygone era. It's a place where history can be presented in a way that brings reflection, and by doing so impacts on the decisions we make in the future and is captured well in this whakataukī, "Titiro whakamuri, kia whakaata i a tatou kia kaha ai to tatou haere whakamua". Look back and reflect so that we can together move forward.

History happens daily and the museum has been working with Fulton Hogan and NZTA to capture the key aspects of the Awakino Tunnel project. Both NZTA and Fulton Hogan have created a display that defines the project scope, outlining the engineering works and communicates recent activity. The purpose of the display is to keep the community and the public informed on the project progress. The team is excited to be working with NZTA and Fulton Hogan on this project.

Every month something new happens in and around the museum. There are more project ideas than there are people to pull them together. If you have a particular interest topic that you would like to contribute to, Jennifer would love to hear from you

ART GALLERY: Denise Newland and Pat Greenfield didn't really know each that well and they were both visitng the museum at the same time a few months ago. We asked each of them if they would like to exhibit and they both said no - "I don't have enough work" so it was suggested that they exhibit together. Since that decision was made a wonderful friendship has flourished and this shows in their delightful exhibition named 'Diversity'. Do come in

and check out the incredible variety of work on display from carvings (stone and bone), geometrical drawings and paintings, colour pencilled works, to photography! On until September 24. And then it's that time of the year that we get to check out what the Cluster Schools' art is going to be for their exhibition that starts on September 25.

TAINUI HISTORICAL SOCIETY

From our own correspondent (Taranaki Herald, 23 September 1920)

September 21 - As a result of its recent victories the Awakino Football Club received a challenge from a Maori team selected from Natives living between Tongaporutu and Mahoenui. The challenge aroused considerable interest and when the teams met last Saturday there was naturally a general flocking to Awakino to witness the result. The teams took the field near enough to 2.30 though there was some delay partly owing to the football bladder leaking and partly owing to the difficulty of securing a referee as the usual referee was absorbed in the Awakino team. In appearance the Maori team reminded one somewhat of the Maori team that visited Australia a few years ago, but not as regards uniformity of attire, or yet as regards alertness so that any suspicion of them being dark horses was soon dispelled. For the first five minutes the game was very fast and the ball travelled some, but after that the "All Blacks" found the pace too hot and judging by the amount of puffing and blowing you could tell that the majority was becoming overcome by that "done his dashness" sensation that is hard to throw off. However the skippers had wisely decided to play four spells (or eight if necessary) instead of the orthodox half time, and for this they earned the duskies' life-long gratitude. Score upon score was piled up against them until the welcome whistle sounded with the score reading 17 to nil in the pakehas favour.

Interesting side shows during the progress of the game was an impromptu attack by dogs on a neighbours quite inoffensive pig, an uninvited visit from a rather vicious looking young bull, and the inevitable dog fight.




